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## HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING A STUDY ON THE FEASIBILITY OF TRANSFERRING JURISDICTION OVER THE COORDINATION OF THE EVALUATION AND MANAGEMENT OF BURIAL SITES OF NATIVE HAWAIIAN ORIGIN FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES TO THE OFFICE OF HAWAIIAN AFFAIRS.

1 WHEREAS, the protection and preservation of prehistoric and 2 historic native Hawaiian burial sites, helps to ensure that 3 native Hawaiian ancestors are afforded dignity and respect; and 4 5 WHEREAS, in Hawaiian culture, ancestral bones, or iwi, 6 possess the person's mana, or spiritual essence; after death, 7 only the iwi were considered sacred because they contained the 8 person's mana; and 9 10 WHEREAS, native Hawaiians interred the remains of the deceased at night to prevent enemies from locating them, and 11 attempting to steal, degrade, or otherwise use the spiritual 12 power contained in the remains; and 13 14 WHEREAS, for Hawaiians today, the proper treatment of 15 ancestral bones remains essential to avoid insulting the 16 person's spirit or bringing trauma and harm to living 17 descendants; and 18 19 WHEREAS, the State Historic Preservation Division (SHPD) of 20 the Department of Land and Natural Resources (DLNR) is currently 21 22 responsible for the coordination of the evaluation and 23 management of burial sites under Chapter 6E, Hawaii Revised 24 Statutes; and 25 WHEREAS, the vast responsibilities of SHPD's Burial Sites 26 27 Program include the care, management, and protection of the 28 estimated hundreds of thousands of unmarked ancestral native Hawaiian burial sites situated throughout the state; and 29



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WHEREAS, issues before SHPD's Burial Sites Program can be 1 2 contentious, highly emotive, and often involve complex aspects of landowner, familial, and cultural rights; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, there have been concerns about the management and operations of SHPD, including frustrations concerning the Burial 6 7 Sites Program; and 8 WHEREAS, the Office of Hawaiian Affairs (OHA) has expertise 9 in Hawaiian culture and the location of burial sites of native 10 11 Hawaiian origin; now, therefore, 12 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 13 Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 14 of 2010, that OHA is requested to study the feasibility of 15 transferring the responsibilities of SHPD relating to the 16 coordination of the evaluation and management of burial sites of 17 native Hawaiian origin under Chapter 6E, Hawaii Revised 18 Statutes, including management of the Island Burial Councils; 19 20 and 21 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature requests the study to include: 23 24 The feasibility of transferring the inherent police 25 (1)powers of DLNR along with the responsibilities of 26 enforcing burial site protection laws; 27 28 The ability of OHA to access private, state, and 29 (2) 30 county parcels to investigate inadvertent discoveries of human skeletal remains, including to classify the 31 ethnicity of the remains, under current law; and 32 33 34 (3) The staffing, funding, and other resources necessary for OHA to undertake these responsibilities; 35 36 37 and



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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that OHA is requested to submit its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than 20 days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2011; and

6 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 7 Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the Board of 8 Trustees of the Office of Hawaiian Affairs, Chairperson of the 9 Board of Land and Natural Resources, Chairperson of each of the 10 Island Burial Councils, and Mayor and Chairperson of the County 11 Council of each county.
