HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE STATE HISTORIC PRESERVATION DIVISION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES AND THE OFFICE OF HAWAIIAN AFFAIRS TO WORK TOGETHER TO ADDRESS AND CLARIFY THE TERM "BURIAL SITE".

1 WHEREAS, caves and lava tubes are among the types of places 2 where Native Hawaiians historically buried their loved ones; and 3 4 WHEREAS, under traditional and customary practices, Native 5 Hawaiians are obligated to ensure that human remains are

8 WHEREAS, the interment of Native Hawaiian remains in caves 9 and lava tubes ensures the least disruption to loved ones; and

undisturbed and receive proper care and respect; and

11 WHEREAS, section 6E-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, defines 12 "burial site" as "any specific unmarked location where 13 prehistoric or historic human skeletal remains and their 14 associated burial goods are interred, and its immediate 15 surrounding archaeological context, deemed a unique class of 16 historic property and not otherwise included in section 6E-41"; 17 and

19 WHEREAS, it is not clear whether the term "burial site," as 20 defined by section 6E-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, includes a 21 cave or lava tube, or a portion of a cave or lava tube, where 22 sufficient physical or cultural evidence suggests that the cave 23 or lava tube, or a portion thereof, was used for or viewed as a 24 burial site; and

26 WHEREAS, clarifying the definition of "burial site" would 27 assist in protecting Native Hawaiian remains from desecration or 28 improper handling, and help in preventing disputes regarding 29 burial sites; and

31 WHEREAS, by working together, the State Historic
32 Preservation Division of the Department of Land and Natural
33 Resources and the Office of Hawaiian Affairs may be able to come

to an agreement as to whether the term "burial site" includes 1 all or a portion of a cave or lava tube that was used or viewed 2 3 as a burial site; now, therefore,

5 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 6 7 of 2010, that the State Historic Preservation Division of the 8 Department of Land and Natural Resources and the Office of Hawaiian Affairs are requested to work together to address and 9 10 clarify the interpretation of the term "burial site," and 11 determine whether it includes all or a portion of a cave or lava tube that was used or viewed as a burial site; and 12 13

14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the State Historic Preservation Division of the Department of Land and Natural Resources and the 15 Office of Hawaiian Affairs are requested to submit a report on 16 the results of its meetings, including any proposed legislation 17 to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the 18 convening of the Regular Session of 2011; and 19

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 21 Resolution be transmitted to the Administrator of the State 22 Historic Preservation Division of the Department of Land and 23 Natural Resources and the Chairperson of the Board of Trustees 24 of the Office of Hawaiian Affairs. 25
