HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HAWAIIAN HOME LANDS TO REVISE ITS PRESENT POLICIES ON MATTERS OF SUCCESSORSHIP.

WHEREAS, the present successorship, a minimum of twenty-1 2 five per cent blood quantum, is insufficient to assure the 3 transfer of lessee rights to successors who are of less than 4 twenty-five per cent Hawaiian blood; and 5 6 WHEREAS, a significant number of intermarriages occur 7 between qualified lessees and non-qualified spouses; and 8 WHEREAS, the Hawaiian population's blood quantum reduces 9 with every passing generation, and, in some families, three or 10 four times in one lessee's lifetime; and 11 12 WHEREAS, now is the time to reduce the required blood 13 quantum for successors presently awaiting transfer; and 14 15 16 WHEREAS, to preserve the transfer of lands subject to the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act of 1920, as amended, the 17 Department of Hawaiian Home Lands should make immediate changes 18 19 to the current procedures for lessee successorship; now, therefore, 20 21 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 22 Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 23 of 2010, that the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands is requested 24 to revise its present policies and procedures by lowering the 25 blood quantum requirement to 12.5 per cent for eligible 26 27 successors; and 28 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 29 30 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, the President of the 31 Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the 32

Chairperson of the Hawaiian Homes Commission, and the members of 1 2 Hawaii's congressional delegation.
