HOUSE RESOLUTION

COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING THE NATIONAL KIDNEY FOUNDATION, ORGAN DONOR CENTER OF HAWAII, FRESENIUS MEDICAL SERVICES, LIBERTY DIALYSIS, CLINICAL LABORATORIES OF HAWAII, AND OHANA HEALTH CARE FOR RAISING AWARENESS ABOUT ORGAN DONATION AND KIDNEY DISEASE.

1 WHEREAS, the spirit of giving has long been a fundamental 2 part of Hawaii's culture; and 3 WHEREAS, Hawaii residents have continued in this tradition 4 5 of generosity by choosing to help many local residents who are 6 waiting for a life-saving organ transplant; and 7 8 WHEREAS, organ donation is the gift of a kidney, heart, lung, liver, pancreas, or other vital organ for medical 9 transplantation to others in serious need; and 10 11 12 WHEREAS, organ transplantation is regarded as a standard medical treatment for a number of medical conditions and 13 14 diseases, including chronic kidney disease, and thousands of individuals receive life-saving organ transplants each year; and 15 16 17 WHEREAS, survival rates following an organ transplant are impressive - for instance, the one-year survival rate for kidney 18 19 transplant recipients is almost 96 percent, for heart recipients, over 82 percent, and for liver recipients, more than 20 21 80 percent; and 22 23 WHEREAS, despite the growing number of successful transplant operations each year, more than 100,000 people 24 nationwide remain on the waiting list for an organ, and in 25 Hawaii, approximately 395 seriously-ill people of all ethnic 26 27 groups are waiting for a liver, kidney, or pancreas transplant; 28 and

1 WHEREAS, nationwide, approximately 16 people in need of an 2 organ transplant die every day, and in 2008, 16 people died in 3 Hawaii while on the organ transplant waitlist; and 4 5 WHEREAS, the majority of transplant candidates on the transplant waiting list in Hawaii are awaiting a donor kidney, 6 and the majority of the transplant operations performed in 7 Hawaii are kidney transplants; and 8 9 10 WHEREAS, one person's donated vital organs can save the lives of up to seven other people who need an organ transplant; 11 12 and 13 WHEREAS, the National Kidney Foundation's mission is to 14 15 prevent kidney and urinary tract diseases, improve the health and well-being of individuals and families affected by these 16 17 diseases, and increase the availability of all organs and tissue for transplantation in Hawaii; and 18 19 20 WHEREAS, in Hawaii, persons may easily register to become organ donors by registering on the Donate Life Hawaii website, 21 22 www.donatelifehawaii.com; and 23 24 WHEREAS, the Organ Donor Center of Hawaii is the only 25 federally-designated, private, nonprofit, charitable organization authorized to recover organs and tissue for 26 transplant in the State of Hawaii; and 27 28 29 WHEREAS, the Organ Donor Center of Hawaii has coordinated efforts to procure organ and tissue donations and find 30 31 appropriate recipients for the donations, a process that includes: 32 33 34 (1) Evaluating potential donors; 35 (2) Presenting the option of donation to families; 36 37 (3) Providing medical management to donors; and 38

(4) Placing organs according to nationally-established 1 2 criteria; 3 4 and 5 6 WHEREAS, Fresenius Medical Care's dialysis services entity, Fresenius Medical Services, operates 1,700 outpatient dialysis 7 8 clinics nationwide; and 9 10 WHEREAS, Fresenius Medical Services is dedicated to providing the highest guality standards in dialysis care and 11 12 products in the industry to meet the needs of patients and affiliated physicians; and 13 14 15 WHEREAS, Fresenius Medical Services - Renal Therapy Group is responsible for the manufacture and distribution of a variety 16 17 of dialysis products and equipment, including dialysis machines, dialyzers, and other dialysis-related supplies; and 18 19 WHEREAS, Liberty Dialysis works closely with nonprofit 20 organizations to provide an outstanding level of care for 21 patients with kidney disease; and 22 23 WHEREAS, Liberty Dialysis has a history of developing 24 25 clinics in underserved communities in conjunction with local physicians and nonprofit organizations; and 26 27 28 WHEREAS, Liberty Dialysis has dialysis facilities on the islands of Hawaii, Kauai, Molokai, Maui, and Oahu; and 29 30 31 WHEREAS, March 11, 2010, is World Kidney Day, organized to 32 raise awareness of kidney disease prevention, promote preventative behavior, and encourage screenings for diabetes and 33 hypertension, both of which contribute to chronic kidney 34 disease; and 35 36 37 WHEREAS, since its inception, Clinical Laboratories of Hawaii has steadfastly executed its vision to serve the unique 38 39 needs of its clients; and
