HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE HONOLULU LIQUOR COMMISSION TO STUDY THE FEASIBILITY OF MANDATORY STATEWIDE TRAINING STANDARDS FOR SELLERS AND SERVERS OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES.

WHEREAS, as of January 1, 2009, Hawaii was one of only 15 1 states without an alcoholic beverage server training law, 2 3 according to the National Institutes of Health; and 4 WHEREAS, unlike most states, Hawaii lacks a state liquor 5 commission and instead leaves the licensing and regulation of 6 commercial alcoholic beverages to be handled by county 7 jurisdiction according to the Hawaii Revised Statutes; and 8 9 WHEREAS, current server training requirements vary 10 11 significantly by county and when certification is granted to an employee in one county, it is not transferable to establishments 12 in other counties; and 13 14 WHEREAS, one of the contributing factors to Hawaii's high 15 rate of drunk driving fatalities and violent crimes may be the 16 lack of training to identify and deal with overdrinking by 17 patrons, to refuse service to underage drinkers, and to 18 19 understand the consequences of driving while intoxicated; and 20 WHEREAS, the Legislature wants to deter driving under the 21 influence of alcohol by providing the county liquor commissions 22 with a statutory tool to render their activities more 23 effectively and not to interfere with or compromise their 24 25 continuing work; now, therefore, 26 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 27 Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 28 of 2010, that the Honolulu Liquor Commission (Commission) is 29 requested to study the feasibility of establishing mandatory 30 uniform statewide standards for the training and certification 31 of those involved in the selling and serving of alcoholic 32

33 beverages in commercial establishments, including identifying



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who should be trained, impacts on liability insurance, and costs 1 2 to establishments; and 3 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Commission, in 4 collaboration with the Mothers Against Drunk Driving Hawaii, is 5 requested to establish a working group of appropriate 6 governmental and community agencies to provide input into this 7 study; and 8 9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Commission is requested to 10 11 submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than 20 12 13 days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2011; and 14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 15 16 Resolution be transmitted to the Director of the Honolulu Liquor Commission, Attorney General, Mayors of each county, Chairperson 17 of the Council for each of the counties, and Chairperson of the 18 19 Liquor Commissions or Liquor Control Adjudication Boards of Hawaii, Kauai, and Maui counties, and Executive Director of 20 Mothers Against Drunk Driving Hawaii. 21
