## HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE BUREAU TO CONDUCT A STUDY REGARDING THE TECHNICAL FEASIBILITY AND LEGAL IMPLICATIONS OF REPLACING REFERENCES TO PROSTITUTION IN THE HAWAII REVISED STATUTES WITH THE TERM COMMERCIAL SEXUAL EXPLOITATION.

WHEREAS, there have been laws against prostitution as long 1 or longer than prostitution has been the "world's oldest 2 3 profession"; and 4 WHEREAS, prostitution here and elsewhere has long been 5 perceived as conduct that amounts to an affront against 6 community morals by individuals acting for personal profit; and 7 8 WHEREAS, prostitution is increasingly understood to be the 9 organized criminal sexual exploitation of its victims, typically 10 women and children; and 11 12 WHEREAS, other jurisdictions are moving toward aligning 13 their statutory language with the evolving understanding of 14 prostitution as commercial sexual exploitation; and 15 16 WHEREAS, replacing references to prostitution in the Hawaii 17 Revised Statutes, with references to commercial sexual 18 exploitation may have unintended consequences involving 19 inconsistent cross-references or conflicts with existing case 20 law; now, therefore, 21 22 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 23 Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 24 of 2010, that the Legislative Reference Bureau is requested to 25 conduct a study of the technical feasibility of replacing 26 references in the Hawaii Revised Statutes with the term 27 commercial sexual exploitation; and 28 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislative Reference 30 Bureau is requested to: 31 32



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Conduct research to determine what other jurisdictions

have changed references to prostitution to commercial sexual exploitation or similar language; (2) Examine whether, if the Legislature determines as a matter of policy that the Hawaii Revised Statutes should refer to commercial sexual exploitation instead of prostitution, that goal can be achieved with a global replacement of terms or would require, because of inconsistent cross-references, improper sentence syntax, or other reasons, a section by section amendment of the Hawaii Revised Statutes; and Examine what effect, if any, a change in terminology (3) would have on the continued viability of case law construing prior versions of the Hawaii Revised Statutes would have; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislative Reference Bureau is requested to submit its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature not later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2011; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the Director of the Legislative Reference Bureau.
