## HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE COUNTY OF MAUI, IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, TO CONDUCT A FEASIBILITY STUDY TO DETERMINE THE COST AND OTHER FACTORS RELATING TO THE CONSTRUCTION OF A FIXED-RAIL TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM CONNECTING THE KAHULUI-WAILUKU AREA, KIHEI, AND LAHAINA ON THE ISLAND OF MAUI.

1 WHEREAS, the de facto population of the county of Maui 2 increased thirty-five per cent from 128,094 in 2000, to 143,574 3 in 2008; and

5 WHEREAS, continued increases in the population exacerbate 6 traffic congestion on a roadway network whose capacity was not 7 designed to handle current roadway usage; and

9 WHEREAS, Maui is in a unique position to develop a light 10 rail plan prior to extensive development, allowing for a more 11 cost effective plan that takes into account future development 12 scenarios; and

14 WHEREAS, Oahu provides a prescient example of the 15 difficulties involved with introducing light rail to an 16 overdeveloped area; and

18 WHEREAS, the populations living in Kahului, Kihei, and 19 Lahaina are the three densest in Maui county with the exception 20 of Wailuku; and

22 WHEREAS, for transportation purposes, Wailuku, which ranks 23 third in population behind Kahului and Kihei, can be considered 24 as a twin of Kahului -- the two contiguous towns are almost as 25 one; and

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1 WHEREAS, these towns are also among the favorite destinations of visitors to Maui and the roads connecting them 2 are heavily traveled; now, therefore, 3 4 5 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 6 of 2010, that the County of Maui, in conjunction with the 7 8 Department of Transportation, is requested to: 9 Conduct a feasibility study to determine the costs and 10 (1)steps needed to construct a fixed-rail system of 11 transportation connecting the Kahului-Wailuku area, 12 Kihei, and Lahaina on the island of Maui; 13 14 Identify various systems involving fixed rail as a (2)15 means of transport for further examination; and 16 17 Consider and examine all relevant potential issues (3) 18 such as land use, leasing or purchase of land, the 19 exercise of eminent domain, environmental effects, 20 disruption to existing traffic flow, as well as actual 21 planning, engineering, and construction costs of the 22 system with minimum and maximum number of stations on 23 the line and their location, including an adequate 24 25 supply of labor to carry out such a project; and 26 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County of Maui is requested to report findings and recommendations to the Legislature and 28 the Governor including: 29 30 (1)Final cost estimates; 31 32 33 (2) Detailed discussion of potential impediments to the construction of a fixed-rail system on Maui; and 34 35 36 (3) Recommendations to overcome these impediments; 37 in an interim and a final report no later than twenty days prior 38 to the convening of the Regular Sessions of 2011 and 2012, 39 respectively; and 40 41
