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HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES, IN COLLABORATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SERVICES OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU, AND ANY OTHER AGENCIES OR ENTITIES NECESSARY, TO DEVELOP A PLAN TO RESOLVE ISSUES RELATED TO HOMELESS INDIVIDUALS LIVING IN ABANDONED VEHICLES.

WHEREAS, residents and businesses have complained about

homeless individuals living in abandoned vehicles in 2 neighborhoods throughout the City and County of Honolulu (C&C of 3 Honolulu); and 4 5 6 WHEREAS, homeless individuals living in abandoned vehicles may present a health and safety hazard to surrounding residents 7 and businesses, particularly when there is broken glass, vehicle 8 parts, and food scraps littering the area; and 9 10 WHEREAS, residents and businesses have also expressed 11 concerns regarding criminal activity occurring in and around 12 these abandoned vehicles, some of which are homes for homeless 13 individuals; and 14 15 WHEREAS, at times, the abandoned vehicles being used for 16 habitation are parked on roads where jurisdiction is unclear; 17 18 and 19 WHEREAS, Chapter 290, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), 20 identifies an abandoned vehicle, if not defined by county 21 22 ordinance, as one "left unattended for a continuous period of more than twenty-four hours and it is unlawfully parked on any 23 public highway or other public property or private lands defined 24 as a setback, shoulder, easement, or right of way that is 25 adjacent to or part of a public highway"; and 26 27 28 WHEREAS, Chapter 291C-112, HRS, prohibits individuals from using vehicles for "purposes of human habitation, whether or not 29 the vehicle is designed or equipped for that purpose, while the 30

vehicle is parked on any roadway, street, or highway or other



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public property between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m."; 1 2 and 3 4 WHEREAS, Chapter 291C-112, HRS, also prohibits such use of vehicles on private property at any time of the day without the 5 authorization of the owner or occupant of the land; and 6 7 8 WHEREAS, while these laws allow for the situation of homeless individuals living in abandoned vehicles to be dealt 9 with in many cases, other cases are not as clear and the 10 situation does not lend itself to an expeditious solution; now, 11 therefore, 12 13 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 14 15 Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2010, that the Department of Human Services, in collaboration 16 17 with the Department of Transportation, Department of 18 Transportation Services of the City and County of Honolulu, and 19 any other agencies or entities necessary, to develop a plan to resolve issues related to homeless individuals living in 20 abandoned vehicles, including a means of determining 21 jurisdiction of roads whose jurisdiction is unclear; and 22 23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Human 24 Services is requested to submit a report to the Legislature on 25 its findings and recommendations, including any suggested 26 legislation, no later than 20 days prior to the convening of the 27 Regular Session of 2011; and 28 29 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Human Services, 31 Director of Transportation, and Director of Transportation 32 Services of the City and County of Honolulu. 33 34 35 10m Brown 36 OFFERED BY:
