HOUSE RESOLUTION

SUPPORTING CONGRESSIONAL AND STATE FUNDING FOR BROADBAND INFRASTRUCTURE.

WHEREAS, the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009
 authorized \$7,200,000,000 in federal stimulus grants to develop
 access to broadband telecommunication technology across the
 country; and

6 WHEREAS, most states are leaving the infrastructure portion 7 of the grant applications to the telecommunication service 8 providers and are instead focusing on building interest in, and 9 the future sustainability of, broadband telecommunication 10 service; and

12 WHEREAS, in rural areas of the country, many people do not 13 have equal access to broadband and do not know what information 14 and services are available by computer; and 15

16 WHEREAS, distance learning technology can aid students in 17 rural areas in advancing their educational needs, including 18 advanced placement classes; and

20 WHEREAS, broadband can expand telemedicine and remote 21 monitoring networks to allow consumers access to healthcare 22 regardless of location, including rural areas; and 23 24 WHEREAS, an adequate broadband infrastructure is needed in 25 providing telemedicine and making electronic health records 26 usable; and

28 WHEREAS, broadband promotes economic development and 29 enables telecommuting, telemedicine, telepresence, distance 30 learning, and e-commerce; and 31

WHEREAS, broadband in rural communities enables the 1 development of home businesses; and 2 3 4 WHEREAS, rural communities are negatively impacted by the 5 lack of broadband services that could advance their educational, 6 health, and economic capabilities; now, therefore, 7 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 8 Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 9 of 2010, that this body requests and supports congressional and 10 state funding for broadband infrastructure in rural areas; and 11 12 13 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 14 Resolution be transmitted to the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, the Majority Leader of the United 15 States Senate, the members of Hawaii's congressional delegation, 16 the Mayor and Council Chair of the County of Hawaii, the Mayor 17 and Council Chair of the City and County of Honolulu, the Mayor 18
