## HOUSE RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES TO COMPLETE A COMPREHENSIVE WATER CONSERVATION PLAN.

WHEREAS, water constitutes Hawai'i's most precious natural,
 economic, and cultural resource; and

WHEREAS, water has sustained countless generations of people in Hawai'i, beginning with the first settlers to the islands—the Native Hawaiians—who developed efficient and sustainable ways of harnessing the resource for their agricultural and aquacultural systems; and

10 WHEREAS, the Hawai'i Constitution provides that, along with 11 other natural resources, water is a public trust resource to be 12 managed and regulated for the benefit of the people, and 13 mandates the setting of overall water conservation policies by a 14 water resources agency; and

16 WHEREAS, in 1987, the Fourteenth Legislature enacted the
17 State Water Code, codified in Chapter 174C, Hawaii Revised
18 Statutes, to provide guidance and direction for the managing and
19 safeguarding of Hawaii's water resources; and

WHEREAS, in 2005, the Department of Land and Natural 21 Resources (DLNR), through the Commission on Water Resource 22 Management (CWRM), drafted the Prototype Water Conservation Plan 23 to develop policies and procedures that could be applied to 24 typical government facilities statewide addressing both potable 25 and non-potable water demands, identifying practical water 26 27 conservation measures, and developing implementation schedules 28 and budgets; and

30 WHEREAS, the Prototype Water Conservation Plan called for 31 the preparation of a larger, more comprehensive State agency 32 water conservation plan; however, this was never finalized and 33 to this day remains unimplemented; and

WHEREAS, population increase and urban development in 1 2 Hawai'i have resulted in a serious imbalance between water use and available water resources; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, the total fresh water available for urban use is 6 beginning to reach the limit before desalination and other costly measures become necessary; and 7 8 9 WHEREAS, every day hundreds of gallons of potable water are wasted because of inefficient water management systems, leaky 10 faucets, unrepaired underground leaks, and use of irrigation 11 systems that water more frequently and longer than soils are 12 able to accept or plants need, causing runoff and ponding, and 13 14 constantly swamping certain areas; and 15 WHEREAS, broken sprinkler heads can often be seen in public 16 17 places, along highways and in parks, and on private property, visibly wasting water; and 18 19 20 WHEREAS, improvements to indoor plumbing fixtures, such as shower heads and faucet aerators, have increased water savings, 21 yet readily available improvements to outdoor landscaping water 22 fixtures have not been widely adopted; and 23 24 25 WHEREAS, because most potable water must be electrically pumped to upland reservoirs to provide users with steady water 26 pressure, infrastructure, maintenance, and repair costs cause an 27 28 increase in the cost of providing clean water; and 29 30 WHEREAS, water conservation is a low-cost way to expand available water resources and engage the public in the 31 collective effort to safequard Hawai'i's water resources; and 32 33 34 WHEREAS, the economy has forced state offices to cut back 35 staff and reduced their ability to accomplish longstanding, but incomplete, goals relating to water conservation; and 36 37 WHEREAS, landscaping industry groups, conservation groups, 38 and major water users are willing and able to assist in the 39 40 completion of the long-awaited statewide plan for water conservation, and to facilitate its implementation; and 41

WHEREAS, to ensure there is enough water now and in the
 future for all of Hawai'i's people, immediate steps must be taken
 to make the most efficient use of the state's existing water
 supplies; now, therefore,

6 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session 7 of 2010, that the Department of Land and Natural Resources, in 8 partnership with the Commission on Water Resource Management, is 9 urged to immediately complete the drafting of a comprehensive 10 statewide plan for water conservation to establish a set of 11 12 clear and comprehensive policies and procedures to protect and 13 conserve Hawai'i's valuable water resources, particularly addressing landscaping; and 14

16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Land and 17 Natural Resources and the Commission on Water Resource 18 Management are requested to include the landscaping industry and 19 conservation groups in the development of a sound and achievable 20 statewide plan for water conservation; and 21

22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Land and 23 Natural Resources is requested to submit a report of its 24 progress to the Legislature no later than 20 days prior to the 25 convening of the Regular Session of 2011; and

27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this
28 Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the Board of
29 Land and Natural Resources.
