A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MAKUA.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by adding a 2 new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read as follows: 3 4 "CHAPTER 5 MAKUA VALLEY RESERVE 6 S -1 Administration of chapter. The Makua valley 7 reserve commission and the department of land and natural 8 resources shall administer this chapter. 9 S -2 Definitions. As used in this chapter, unless the 10 context otherwise requires: 11 "Commission" means the Makua valley reserve commission. 12 "Department" means the department of land and natural 13 resources. 14 "Valley reserve" means the area designated on the island of Oahu as Makua valley, including the three ahupua`a of 15 16 Kahanahaiki, Makua, and Koi`ahi. 17 -3 Reservation of uses. (a) The Makua valley reserve S 18 shall be used solely and exclusively for the following purposes: SB LRB 09-1434.doc

1 and arrest offenders or issue citations in all matters 2 relating to enforcement of the laws and rules 3 applicable to the valley reserve. 4 S -5 Commission. (a) There is established the Makua 5 valley reserve commission to be placed within the department of 6 land and natural resources for administrative purposes as 7 provided in section 26-35. The commission shall consist of ten 8 members to be appointed in the manner and to serve for the terms 9 provided in section 26-34; provided that: 10 One member shall be a member of Malama Makua; (1)11 (2)One member shall be a member of Hui Malama O Makua; 12 One member shall be a member of Koa Mana; (3)13 (4) One member shall be a representative of families that 14 were evicted from Makua valley or whose lands in Makua 15 valley were condemned by the federal government; 16 (5) One member shall be appointed by the governor from a 17 list provided by the Waianae coast community; 18 (6) One member shall be a trustee or representative of the 19 office of Hawaiian affairs; One member shall be the commanding officer of the 20 (7)21 United States Army in the Pacific, or the commanding 22 officer's designee;

1 approvals pertaining to the valley reserve are 2 transferred to the commission; 3 (7)Shall adopt rules in accordance with chapter 91 that 4 are necessary for the purposes of this chapter and 5 shall maintain a record of its proceedings and 6 actions; and 7 (8) May delegate to the executive director or employees of 8 the commission, by formal commission action, such 9 power and authority vested in the commission by this 10 chapter as the commission deems reasonable and proper 11 for the effective administration of this chapter. 12 S Interim activities of the commission. Prior to the -7 13 return of Makua valley from the United States Army to the State, 14 the commission may enter into discussions with the Army to facilitate the expedient return of Makua valley upon the 15 16 expiration of the Army's lease. 17 **Penalty.** Any person who violates any of the laws S -8 18 or rules applicable to the valley reserve shall be quilty of a 19 petty misdemeanor and shall be fined not more than \$1,000 or 20 imprisoned not more than thirty days, or both, for each offense. 21 Each day of each violation shall be deemed a separate offense.

1	§ -9 General administrative penalties. (a) Except as						
2	otherwise provided by law, the commission may set, charge, and						
3	collect administrative fines, or bring legal action to recover						
4	administrative costs of the commission or the department, or						
5	payment for damages, or for the cost to correct damages						
6	resulting from a violation of this chapter or any rule adopted						
7	thereunder. The administrative fines shall be as follows:						
8	(1) For a first violation, by a fine of not more than						
9	\$10,000;						
10	(2) For a second violation within five years of a previous						
11	violation, by a fine of not more than \$15,000; and						
12	(3) For a third or subsequent violation within five years						
13	of the last violation, by a fine of not more than

15	(b) In addition, an administrative fine of up to \$5,000						
16	may be levied for each specimen of natural resource or any						
17	historic property taken, killed, injured, broken, or damaged in						
18	violation of any rule adopted under this chapter. For purposes						
19	of this section, "natural resource" includes any archaeological						
20	artifacts, minerals, any aquatic or terrestrial life or wildlife						
21	or parts thereof, including their eggs, and any land plants or						
22	parts thereof, including seeds. For purposes of this section,

"historic property" means any building, structure, object,
 districts, area, or site, including heiau and underwater site
 that is over fifty years old.

4 (c) Any criminal penalty for any violation of this chapter 5 or any rule adopted under this chapter shall not be deemed to 6 preclude the commission from bringing a civil legal action to 7 recover additional administrative fines and costs. Any civil legal action against a person to recover administrative fines 8 9 and costs for any violation of this chapter or any rule adopted 10 under this chapter shall not be deemed to preclude the State 11 from pursuing any criminal action against that person.

12 (d) In any judicial proceeding to recover an 13 administrative penalty imposed, the commission need only show 14 that:

15 (1) Notice was given;

16 (2) A hearing was held or the time granted for requesting
17 a hearing has run without a request for a hearing;

18 (3) An administrative penalty was imposed; and

19 (4) The administrative penalty remains unpaid.

20 § -10 Transfer. Upon its return to the State, the
21 resources of Makua valley shall be held in trust as part of the

22 public land trust; provided that the State shall transfer

1 management and control of the valley to the sovereign native 2 Hawaiian entity upon its recognition by the United States and 3 the State of Hawaii. 4 All terms, conditions, agreements, and laws affecting Makua 5 valley, including any ongoing obligations relating to the cleanup of the valley, shall remain in effect unless expressly 6 terminated. 7 8 S -11 Makua valley rehabilitation trust fund. (a) 9 There is created in the state treasury a trust fund to be 10 designated as the Makua valley rehabilitation trust fund to be 11 administered by the department with the prior approval of the commission. Subject to this chapter: 12 All moneys received from the federal government for 13 (1)14 the rehabilitation and environmental restoration of 15 Makua valley; Any moneys appropriated by the legislature to the 16 (2)trust fund; 17 Any proceeds from administrative fines imposed and 18 (3) 19 collected under this chapter; and 20 The interest or return on investments earned from (4) 21 moneys in the trust fund,

shall be deposited in the trust fund and shall be used to
 fulfill the purposes of this chapter.

3 (b) The commission may use moneys in the trust fund to
4 carry out the purposes of this chapter, including hiring
5 employees, specialists, and consultants necessary to complete
6 projects related to the purposes of this chapter.

7 (c) Moneys deposited into or appropriated to the trust
8 fund shall remain available until they are obligated or until
9 the trust fund is repealed.

10 (d) The trust fund shall be repealed on July 1, 2045. The 11 commission shall transfer to the credit of the state general 12 fund, all unexpended or unencumbered balances remaining in the 13 trust fund prior to June 30, 2045; provided that all unexpended 14 or unencumbered balances of federal moneys shall be disbursed in 15 accordance with applicable federal law.

16 § -12 Severability. If any provision of this chapter or 17 the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held 18 invalid, the invalidity shall not affect other provisions or 19 applications of this chapter that can be given effect without 20 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the 21 provisions of this chapter are severable."

 privileges heretofore exercised by the United States Army in its
 use of Makua valley throughout the term of its lease.
 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
