A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HIGHWAY SAFETY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Section 286-102.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended b	y amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
3	"(b)	The provisional license shall entitle the provisional
4	licensee	to drive the class of motor vehicles specified in
5	subsectio	n (a) upon the roadways of the State; provided that:
6	(1)	The provisional licensee shall have the provisional
7		license in the provisional licensee's immediate
8		possession while driving;
9	(2)	All occupants of the motor vehicle shall be restrained
10		by safety belts or a child passenger restraint system
11		as required under sections 291-11.5 and 291-11.6;
12	(3)	The provisional licensee shall not transport more than
13		one person under the age of eighteen, unless the
14		person is, with respect to the provisional licensee:
15		(A) A household member; or
16		(B) A household member's foster or hanai child,

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1		without being accompanied and supervised by a licensed	
2		driver who is the provisional licensee's parent or	
		driver who is the provisional incensee's parent of	
3		guardian; [and]	
4	(4)	Except as provided in subsection (c), whenever the	
5		provisional licensee is driving between the hours of	
6		11:00 p.m. and 5:00 a.m., a licensed driver who is the	
7		provisional licensee's parent or guardian and is	
8		licensed to operate the same category of motor vehicle	
9		as the licensee, shall be in the motor vehicle and	
10		shall occupy the passenger seat beside the	
11		licensee[-]; and	
12	(5)	<u>A provisional licensee shall not operate a motor</u>	
13		vehicle while engaging in various tasks not associated	
14		with operating a motor vehicle, including but not	
15		limited to the following:	
16		(A) Using a wireless telephone, including a wireless	
17		telephone equipped with a hands-free device, or	
18		any other electronic device including, but not	
19		limited to, portable video games, portable DVD	
20		players, text messengers, Palms, Treos, or	
21		Blackberries;	
22		(B) Consuming food or beverages;	
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1	<u>(C)</u>	Engaging in personal grooming that requires the
2		use of a comb, brush, or other personal grooming
3		device; or
4	(D)	Attempting to reach for any other object or
5		device not related to or necessary for driving."
6	SECTION 2	. Section 286-110, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
7	amended to rea	d as follows:
8	"§286-110	Instruction permits. (a) Any person aged
9	fifteen years	and six months or more who, except for the
10	person's lack	of instruction in operating a motor vehicle, would
11	be qualified t	o obtain a driver's license issued under this part
12	may apply for	a temporary instruction permit at the office of
13	the examiner o	f drivers in the county in which the applicant
14	resides; provi	ded that the applicant complies with section 286-
15	102.5.	
16	(b) The	examiner of drivers shall examine every applicant
17	for an instruc	tion permit. The examination shall include tests
18	of the applica	nt's:
19	(1) Eyes	ight and other physical or mental capabilities to
20	dete	rmine if the applicant is capable of operating a
21	moto	r vehicle;

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(2)	Understanding of highway signs regulating, warning,
	and directing traffic; and
(3)	Knowledge of the traffic laws, ordinances, or
	regulations of the State and the county where the
	applicant resides or intends to operate a motor
	vehicle.

7 If the examiner of drivers is satisfied that the (C) 8 applicant is qualified to receive an instruction permit, the 9 examiner of drivers shall issue the permit entitling the 10 applicant, while having the permit in the applicant's immediate 11 possession, to drive a motor vehicle upon the highways for a 12 period of one year; provided that an applicant who is registered 13 in a driver training course shall be issued a temporary 14 instruction permit for the duration of the course and the 15 termination date of the course shall be entered on the permit. 16 A person who is not licensed to operate the category of motor 17 vehicles to which the driving training course applies shall not operate a motor vehicle in connection with the driving training 18 19 course without a valid temporary instruction permit.

2	vehicle that is being operated belongs. The licensed person		
3	shall occupy a passenger seat beside the permit holder while the		
4	motor vehicle is being operated; provided that if the holder of		
5	the instruction permit is under the age of eighteen years and is		
6	driving between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 5:00 a.m.:		
7	(1)	A licensed driver who is the permit holder's parent or	
8		guardian shall occupy a passenger seat beside the	
9		driver while the motor vehicle is operated, unless the	
10		permit holder is an emancipated minor;	
11	(2)	The licensed driver shall be licensed to operate the	
12		same category of motor vehicles as the motor vehicle	
13		being operated by the holder of the instruction	
14		permit; and	
15	(3)	All occupants of the motor vehicle shall be restrained	
16		by a seat belt assembly or a child passenger safety	
17		restraint system as required under sections 291-11.5	
18		and 291-11.6, notwithstanding any other law to the	
19		contrary.	
20	(e)	A holder of a temporary instruction permit age fifteen	
21	years and	six months or older, but under the age of eighteen	
22	years shall not operate a motor vehicle while engaging in		
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1	various tasks not associated with operating a motor vehicle,		
2	including	but not limited to the following:	
3	(1)	Using a wireless telephone, including a wireless	
4		telephone equipped with a hands-free device, or any	
5		other electronic devices including, but not limited	
6		to, portable video games, portable DVD players, text	
7		messengers, Palms, Treos, or Blackberries;	
8	(2)	Consuming food or beverages;	
9	(3)	Engaging in personal grooming that requires the use of	
10		a comb, brush, or other personal grooming device; or	
11	(4)	Attempting to reach for any other object or device not	
12		related to or necessary for driving.	
13	[.(e)]] (f) No holder of a temporary instruction permit	
14	shall operate a motorcycle or a motor scooter during hours of		
15	darkness or carry any passengers.		
16	[(f)]] <u>(g)</u> No holder of a category 1 or 2 temporary	
17	instruction permit shall have the permit renewed, nor shall the		
18	holder be issued another temporary instruction permit for the		
19	same purpose, unless the holder has taken the examination for a		
20	category 1 or 2 license at least once prior to the expiration of		
21	the temporary instruction permit. If the holder of a temporary		
22	instructio	on permit fails to meet the requirements of this	
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1 section, the holder shall not be permitted to apply for another 2 category 1 or 2 temporary instruction permit for a period of 3 three months. Nothing in this subsection shall affect the right 4 and privilege of any holder of a category 1 or 2 temporary 5 instruction permit to obtain a temporary instruction permit or 6 driver's license for the operation of any other type of motor 7 vehicle.

8 [(g)] (h) The examiner of drivers may accept an 9 application for renewal of an instruction permit no more than 10 thirty days prior to or ninety days after the expiration date of 11 the instruction permit, whereupon the applicant for renewal of 12 an instruction permit shall be exempt from subsection (b)(2) and 13 (3). If an application for renewal of an instruction permit is 14 not made within ninety days after the expiration date of the permit, the applicant shall be treated as applying for a new 15 16 instruction permit and examined in accordance with subsection 17 (b).

18 [(h)] (i) Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, 19 the examiner of drivers may issue an instruction permit to an 20 applicant with a disability who has completed a medical review 21 with this State, and as a condition to licensure is required to 22 pass a road test, but has failed the road test on the SB1054 SD1.DOC *SB1054 SD1.DOC* *SB1054 SD1.DOC*

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1 applicant's first attempt. The instruction permit issued under 2 this subsection may be renewed no more than thirty days prior to 3 or ninety days after the expiration date of the instruction 4 permit upon receiving an updated medical report. [Subsections] 5 <u>Subsection</u> (b)(2) and (3) shall not apply to the issuance or 6 renewal of an instruction permit issued under this subsection.

For the purposes of this subsection, "applicant with a disability" means an applicant who the examiner of drivers has reasonable cause to believe may have a mental or physical infirmity or disability that would make it unsafe to operate a motor vehicle pursuant to section 286-119 and has been medically evaluated by the medical advisory board established pursuant to section 286-4.1."

SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were begun, before its effective date.

17 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed18 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

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SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

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Report Title:

Highway; Safety; Distracted Driving; Motor Vehicle

Description:

Prohibits provisional licensees under 18 and holders of a temporary permit who are age fifteen years and six months but less than eighteen years of age from engaging in various tasks that distract from the primary task of driving such as, the use of all cell phones (including hands-free devices) and all other electronic devices, consuming food or beverages, engaging in personal grooming or attempting to reach for any other object or device, while operating a motor vehicle.
