A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DETENTION AND RETENTION PONDS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. This Act shall be known as the "Charlotte
'Sharkey' Schaefers Act", in memory of the young girl who
drowned in 2004 while attempting to rescue a friend who had
fallen into a retention pond.

5 SECTION 2. The legislature finds that unregulated and 6 poorly maintained rainwater detention and retention ponds can 7 potentially pose a health and safety risk, particularly to 8 Hawaii's children. Since rainwater retention and detention 9 ponds can sometimes be mistaken for recreational bodies of 10 water, safety features may be prudent to protect children from 11 drowning.

12 The purpose of this Act is to establish a task force to 13 investigate and examine the dangers of retention ponds and to 14 recommend appropriate safety measures.

15 SECTION 3. (a) There is established in the department of 16 health a temporary water safety task force to be composed of the 17 following officials or their designee:
