A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EFFECTIVE LEGISLATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that many existing laws
 in the Hawaii Revised Statutes or portions thereof may be
 obsolete, redundant, conflicting, ambiguous, or in need of
 repeal or amendment accordingly. This reduces the effectiveness
 of those laws.
 The purpose of this Act is to establish a permanent
 commission on effective legislation to carry out ongoing review

8 of the Hawaii Revised Statutes.

9 SECTION 2. Chapter 96, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
10 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to
11 read as follows:

12 "<u>§96-</u> <u>Commission on effective legislation.</u> (a) There
13 <u>is established within the office of the ombudsman a commission</u>
14 <u>on effective legislation.</u> The commission shall be composed of:
15 <u>(1)</u> <u>The ombudsman or the ombudsman's designee, who shall</u>
16 <u>serve as chairperson of the commission;</u>

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1	(2)	The director of the legislative reference bureau or
2		the director's designee, who shall serve as vice-
3		chairperson;
4	(3)	Six department heads or their designees representing
5		the executive departments of the State, three of whom
6		shall be appointed by the president of the senate and
7		three of whom shall be appointed by the speaker of the
8		house of representatives; provided that the president
9		of the senate and speaker of the house of
10		representatives may jointly appoint additional
11		department heads or substitute department heads of
12		different executive departments, not sooner than every
13		two years, to facilitate the review of a broader
14		<pre>spectrum of laws;</pre>
15	(4)	The president of the University of Hawaii or the
16		president's designee; and
17	(5)	Four representatives of the counties, one each to be
18		appointed by the mayor of each of the respective
19		counties.
20	(b)	The purpose of the commission is to promote and
21	maintain	the effectiveness of legislation, codified within the
22	Hawaii Re	vised Statutes, to ensure the statutes remain rational,
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1	clear, coherent, and sensible by reviewing existing statutes on
2	an ongoing basis.
3	(c) The commission shall meet on an ongoing basis as
4	necessary. The chairperson shall notify each member of the time
5	and place of a meeting; provided that an executive department
6	with representation on the commission may make a written
7	submission in lieu of or in addition to attendance at a meeting.
8	(d) The commission shall review existing laws within the
9	Hawaii Revised Statutes that are brought to its attention by
10	legislators, state and county agencies, and members of the
11	public; provided that nothing in this section shall prevent the
12	commission or any of its members from reviewing portions of
13	statutory law on their own initiative. The commission shall
14	solicit comment from state and county agencies and the public
15	for purposes of this section. The commission's review shall
16	consist of an examination of whether a statute or statutes or
17	portions thereof are obsolete, redundant, conflicting,
18	ambiguous, or in need of repeal or amendment. The commission
19	shall make a determination in each case and shall incorporate
20	its findings and recommendations in the report required under
21	subsection (e).

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1	(e) The ombudsman shall submit reports of the commission's
2	findings and recommendations made pursuant to subsection (d), to
3	the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening
4	of the regular session. Reports shall be submitted not less
5	than once every other year."
6	SECTION 3. Section 96-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
7	amended to read as follows:
8	"§96-5 Jurisdiction. The ombudsman has jurisdiction to
9	investigate the administrative acts of agencies and the
10	ombudsman may exercise the ombudsman's powers without regard to
11	the finality of any administrative act. The ombudsman has
12	jurisdiction to administer the commission on effective
13	legislation under section 96"
14	SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
15	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2070.

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Report Title:

Commission on Effective Legislation; Ombudsman

Description:

Creates commission on effective legislation within the office of the ombudsman and chaired by the ombudsman. Sets membership to include representatives from 6 executive departments, to be appointed by the senate president and house speaker; the counties; and University of Hawaii. Requires commission to examine existing laws within the Hawaii Revised Statutes referred by legislators, state and county agencies, and the public that may be obsolete, redundant, conflicting, or ambiguous. Requires ombudsman to report to legislature biennially. (SD1)
