2	SECTION 1. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
3	adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
4	as follows:

6	RESPONSIBLE CONSTRUCTION CONTRACTOR LAW
7	§ -A Applicability. (a) This chapter shall apply to
8	public works contracts under chapter 103 and to procurements for
9	construction under chapter 103D, if the general contract amount
10	is \$250,000 or more and to any subcontract of \$50,000 or more in
11	connection with any general contract.
12	(b) This chapter shall not apply to employees covered by a
13	collective bargaining agreement under chapter 89 if the
14	applicability of this chapter is expressly waived in the
15	collective bargaining agreement in clear and unambiguous terms.
16	§ -B Definitions. As used in this chapter, the terms
17	"contract" and "contractor", shall have the same meaning as in
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section 103D-104, as those terms apply to construction. The
term "construction" shall have the same meaning as in section
103D-104.

4 S -C Prerequisites for award of contract. (a) A 5 contractor who submits a bid for a contract for construction 6 shall show proof of compliance with subsection (c) to the 7 comptroller, county counterpart for contracts under chapter 103, 8 or to the procurement officer for contracts under chapter 103D, 9 as applicable, as a prerequisite to being awarded a construction 10 contract; and provided further that the requirements of this 11 subsection shall be deemed incorporated by reference in any 12 contract between the contractor and subcontractor.

13 (b) A subcontractor who subcontracts with a contractor 14 under subsection (a), for a subcontract for construction shall 15 show proof of compliance with subsection (c) to the comptroller 16 or county counterpart for contracts under chapter 103 or to the 17 procurement officer for contracts under chapter 103D, as a 18 prerequisite to being awarded a subcontract; provided that the 19 contractor shall be primarily responsible for presentation of 20 the show of proof under this subsection; and provided further 21 that the requirements of this subsection shall be deemed

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1 incorporated by reference in any contract between the contractor 2 and subcontractor. 3 (c) A contractor or subcontractor, as applicable, shall 4 comply with the following prerequisites: 5 Classify all workers of the contractor and (1) 6 subcontractor as employees; 7 Comply with all applicable labor laws; (2) 8 (3) Comply with the requirements under section 104-2 with 9 regard to prevailing wages; 10 (4) Commit to hiring Hawaii residents to compose not less 11 than eighty per cent of the workforce on the project; 12 provided that the department of labor and industrial 13 relations shall determine those trades in a shortage 14 category in this State, in which case this paragraph 15 shall not apply to shortage category trades; and 16 provided further that those firms that satisfy this 17 paragraph shall be entitled to an adjustment in the 18 bid amount by subtracting therefrom per cent; 19 (5) Provide its employees with a fair and neutral process 20 for resolving work-related issues, that does not force 21 the employee to waive statutory remedies and rights; 22

7	SECTION 2. The purpose of this part is to provide a		
8	preference for offerors on a construction contract under chapter		
9	103D, Haw	aii Revised Statutes, if the contractor is a party to a	
10	construct	ion contract that is registered with the department of	
11	labor and industrial relations at the time of the general		
12	bidding.		
13	SECTION 3. Chapter 103, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
14	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
15	and to re	ad as follows:	
16	" <u>§10</u>	3- Public works construction; apprenticeship	
17	agreement	. (a) A governmental body, as defined in section	
18	103D-104,	that enters into a public contract under this chapter	
19	having of	an estimated value of not less than \$250,000, shall	
20	decrease	the bid amount of a bidder by five per cent if the	
21	bidder is	appropriately licensed and is a party to an	
22	apprentic	eship agreement registered with the department of labor	
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1	and industrial relations and in conformance with chapter 372.		
2	The lowest total bid, taking the preference into consideration,		
3	shall be awarded the contract unless the solicitation provides		
4	for additional award criteria. The contract amount awarded,		
5	however, shall be the amount of the price offered, exclusive of		
6	the preference.		
7	(b) For purposes of subsection (a) in determining whether		
8	there is conformance with chapter 372, the procurement officer		
9	shall consider the actual number of apprentices enrolled in and		
10	the annual number of graduates of the apprenticeship program.		
11	(c) At the time of submission by a bidder of a competitive		
12	sealed bid under section 103D-302 or by an offeror of a		
13	competitive sealed proposal under section 103D-303, a bidder or		
14	offeror, as applicable, shall furnish written proof of being a		
15	party to a registered apprenticeship agreement and, if awarded		
16	the contract, shall continue to certify monthly in writing that		
17	the bidder is a party to a registered apprenticeship agreement.		
18	This subsection shall be deemed to be incorporated into a public		
19	works contract. A bidder who is awarded a contract shall		
20	subject to the following sanctions if, after commencement of		
21	work, the bidder at any time during the construction is no		
22	longer a party to a registered apprenticeship agreement:		
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1	(1)	Temporary or permanent cessation of work on the
2		project, without recourse to breach of contract claims
3		by the bidder; provided that the governmental body
4		shall be entitled to restitution for nonperformance or
5		liquidated damages, as appropriate; or
6	(2)	Proceedings to debar or suspend under section
7		<u>103D-702.</u> "
