## A BILL FOR AN ACT

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1

RELATING TO THE STATE HISTORIC PRESERVATION OFFICER.

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## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

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SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the state historic

10 preservation officer requires extensive training and

11 professional experience as the administrator of the state

12 historic preservation program. The duties of the state historic

13 preservation officer include reviewing nominations for the

14 National Register of Historic Places and maintaining data on

15 historic places in Hawaii that have yet to be nominated. The

16 officer also serves as the State's consultant to federal

17 agencies during reviews of the federal Advisory Council on

18 Historic Preservation's regulations for the protection of

historic places and during identification and assessment of

20 historic properties.

21 Due to the important role of the state historic

22 preservation officer, the legislature originally required the

23 person to be appointed to the position on the basis of

24 professional competence and experience in the field of historic

25 preservation. The legislature further finds, however, that past

- 1 preservation officers based on broadly worded qualifications
- 2 that do not meet nationally accepted professional standards for
- 3 the position. Requiring the individual appointed to possess
- 4 specified qualifications would bring accountability and
- 5 consistency to the position of state historic preservation
- 6 officer.
- 7 The purpose of this Act is to require the governor to
- 8 appoint a person as state historic preservation officer who
- 9 fulfills the qualification standards for the profession
- 10 established by the United States Secretary of the Interior.
- 11 SECTION 2. Section 6E-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 12 amended to read as follows:
- "[+] §6E-5[+] State historic preservation officer. (a)
- 14 The governor shall appoint a state historic preservation
- 15 officer, and may appoint the officer without regard to chapter
- 16 76, who shall be responsible for the comprehensive historic
- 17 preservation program and who shall be the state liaison officer
- 18 for the conduct of relations with the federal government and the
- 19 respective states with regard to matters of historic
- 20 preservation.

17	representa	atives of the identity of the person appointed and the
18	person's	qualifications to serve in that position."
