A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CONTRACTORS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 444-10.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows:
3	"(a) In addition to any other remedy available, [the
4	investigator may issue citations to persons acting in the
5	capacity of or engaging in the business of a contractor within
6	the State, without having a license previously obtained under
7	and in compliance with this chapter and the rules promulgated
8	thereunder. If the investigator determines that a person is
9	acting in the capacity of, or engaging in the business of, a
10	contractor within this State without having a license to so act
11	or engage, the investigator may issue a citation to such
12	person.] citations shall be issued in the manner set forth in
13	this subsection. The investigator shall issue a citation and a
14	cease and desist order, as provided in subsection (b), to a
15	person not exempt under section 444-2, whom the investigator
16	personally observes and determines is acting in the capacity of,
17	or engaging in the business of, a contractor within this State



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1 without having any license in good standing pursuant to this 2 chapter. Where the investigator does not personally observe, 3 but determines that a person not exempt under section 444-2 is 4 acting in the capacity of, or engaging in the business of, a 5 contractor within this State without having any license in good 6 standing pursuant to this chapter, the investigator may issue a 7 citation to that person. (b) Each citation shall be in writing and shall describe 8 9 the basis of the citation, including the specific statutory 10 provisions alleged to have been violated, and shall contain an 11 order to cease and desist from the violation, and an assessment 12 of civil penalties as provided in section 444-23. The citation 13 shall also include notice of the sanctions for violating the 14 cease and desist order. Upon the issuance of a citation, the 15 person cited shall cease work immediately and shall not resume 16 until the person cited holds the licenses required under this chapter to perform the work. All penalties collected under this 17 18 section shall be deposited in the special fund established under 19 section 26-9."

20 SECTION 2. Section 444-23, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
21 amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows:



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1	"(c) Except as provided in subsections (a), (b), (d), and
2	(e), any person who violates or fails to comply with this
3	chapter shall be fined not less than \$100 or more than \$5,000
4	for each violation; provided that any person without any license
5	in good standing pursuant to this chapter who violates section
6	444-9 shall be fined:
7	(1) $[\frac{500}{500}]$ $\frac{2,500}{500}$ or forty per cent of the total contract
8	price, whichever is greater, for the first offense;
9	(2) $[\$1,000]$ $\$3,500$ or forty per cent of the total
10	contract price, whichever is greater, for the second
11	offense; and
12	(3) \$5,000 or forty per cent of the total contract price,
13	whichever is greater, for any subsequent offense,
14	and when the person is or was a defendant or respondent in a
15	separate citation or lawsuit filed with or by the department,
16	all tools, implements, documents, materials, or any other
17	property used by the person in activities violating section
18	444-9 shall be subject to forfeiture as provided by section
19	444-23.5 and shall be turned over to the department for
20	disposition under that section."

21 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed22 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.



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SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Contractors; License Requirements; Citations; Civil Penalties

Description:

Specifies that investigators of the contractors license board may issue citations to both nonexempt persons observed first hand and determined to be unlicensed and nonexempt persons not observed first hand but determined to be unlicensed. Specifies that persons issued cease and desist orders may not resume work until a license is obtained. Increases the flat rate fines for operating without a license.
