A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTHCARE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the QUEST expanded
- 2 access program was established to provide aged, blind, or
- 3 disabled medicaid recipients with coordinated case management,
- 4 improved access to healthcare, and a better quality of services.
- 5 However, the companies with whom the department of human
- 6 services contracted to provide such expanded access services are
- 7 unable to offer the culturally-aware, community-based care that
- 8 is the hallmark of local medical homes. The companies have also
- 9 failed to contract with geographically diverse primary care
- 10 providers, adding another obstacle to accessing service for
- 11 patients located in underserved locations.
- 12 The legislature further finds that two medical homes
- 13 located on Oahu, Waianae Coast Comprehensive Health Center and
- 14 the Waimanalo Health Center, provide cultural, community-based
- 15 services, including integrated behavioral services, which are
- 16 vital to the populations they serve. These medical homes are
- 17 uniquely situated to provide services to the patient populations

- 1 in their geographic area based on their integration with and
- 2 dedication to their respective communities. The Waianae Coast
- 3 Comprehensive Health Center and the Waimanalo Health Center
- 4 benefit not only their patients, but the communities in which
- 5 they are situated, as well. For example, the Waianae Coast
- 6 Comprehensive Health Center is the largest employer on the
- 7 Waianae Coast, and serves as an economic engine in this
- 8 low-income area.
- 9 Additionally, the legislature finds that allowing QUEST
- 10 expanded access recipients to opt out of QUEST and select an
- 11 alternative service plan will save the State money, expand the
- 12 geographic distribution of primary care providers, promote
- 13 community-based medical home models, and allow for state money
- 14 to remain and be reinvested in Hawaii. Giving patients a choice
- 15 of plans will also give the State the opportunity to compare the
- 16 quality, costs, and benefits of healthcare services offered by
- 17 different providers.
- 18 The purpose of this Act is to require the department of
- 19 human services to allow QUEST expanded access recipients the
- 20 choice to opt out of the QUEST plan and receive services through
- 21 AlohaCare from medical homes located in Waimanalo and Waianae.

17	(3)	AlohaCare plan service providers shall offer all	
18		services offered by QUEST expanded access plans as	
19	×	provided in paragraph (1) and shall produce evidence	
20		of a provider network sufficient to deliver all	
21		services to the legislature no later than July 1,	
22		2009;

1	(4)	In addition to the requirements described in	
2		paragraph (3), medical homes providing services under	
3		AlohaCare shall provide community participation	
4		opportunities, job training services, services	
5		required of federally qualified health centers, and	
6		traditional Hawaiian healing services; and	
7	(5)	A pay-for-performance component shall be established	
8		to give the medical homes financial incentives to seek	
9		measurable improvements in the health of their patient	
10		populations.	
11	(b)	The department of human services shall reimburse	
12	AlohaCare	for the provision of services to patients formerly	
13	enrolled	in the QUEST expanded access program who have chosen to	
14	opt out o	f the program in favor of receiving services from the	
15	Waianae Coast Comprehensive Health Center or the Waimanalo		
16	Health Center through AlohaCare.		
17	SECT	ION 3. There is appropriated out of the general	
18	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so	
19	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2009-2010 to		
20	allow QUEST expanded access recipients the choice of health

3	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
4	provided that section 3 shall take effect upon July 1, 2009.
