# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CONSERVATION AND RESOURCES ENFORCEMENT PROGRAM.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 199-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
2	amended to read as follows:	
3	"§199-1 [Board of land and natural resources,] Department	
4	of public safety; powers and duties. The [board of land and	
5	natural resources shall establish within the department of land	
6	and natural resources a ] department of public safety shall have	
7	jurisdiction over the conservation and resources enforcement	
8	program relating to the enforcement of title 12, chapters 6D,	
9	6E, and 6K, and rules adopted thereunder, and shall employ or	
10	appoint, and remove, the following persons, subject to chapter	
11	76 and section 78-1, who shall be provided with suitable badges	
12	or insignia of office by the [department of land and natural	
13	resources: department of public safety:	
14	(1) [An enforcement chief of the department of land and	
15	natural resources, A deputy director of public	
16	safety, who shall be the head of the conservation and	
17	resources enforcement program and shall have charge,	

1		direction, and control, subject to the direction and
2		control of the [board,] director of public safety of
3		all matters relating to the enforcement of title 12,
4		chapters 6D, 6E, and 6K, and rules adopted thereunder
5		and such other matters as the board may from time to
6		time direct[. The enforcement chief shall be an
7		administrator experienced in conservation and
8		resources law enforcement and management]; and
9	(2)	Personnel and enforcement officers of the conservation
10		and resources enforcement program, including but not
11		limited to enforcement officers on a voluntary basis
12		and without pay."
13	SECT	ION 2. Section 199-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
14	amended a	s follows:
15	1.	By amending its title to read:
16	"§19	9-4 [Board of land and natural resources,] Department
17	of public	safety; police powers."
18	2.	By amending subsection (a) to read:
19	"(a)	The [board of land and natural resources] department
20	of public	safety shall have police powers and may appoint and
21	commissio	n enforcement officers within the conservation and
22	resources	enforcement program. Persons appointed and
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    commissioned under this section shall have and may exercise all
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    of the powers and authority of a police officer, including the
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    power of arrest, and in addition to enforcing title 12, chapters
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    6D, 6E, and 6K, and rules adopted thereunder, may enforce all
    other state laws and rules, and county ordinances within all
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6
    lands and waters of the State; provided that [such] the powers
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    shall remain in force and effect only while in actual
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    performance of their duties, which shall include off-duty
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    employment when [such] that employment is for other state
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    departments or agencies. These enforcement officers shall
11
    consist of personnel whose primary duty [will] shall be the
12
    enforcement of title 12, chapters 6D, 6E, and 6K, and the rules
13
    adopted thereunder within the areas under the jurisdiction of
14
    the department of [land and natural resources.] public safety."
15
         SECTION 3. Section 199-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    amended to read as follows:
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         "§199-6 Failure to obey a summons. (a) Any person who
18
    fails to appear at the place and within the time specified in
19
    the summons or citation issued by the officers or their agents
20
    or subordinates, upon that person's arrest for violation of
21
    title 12, chapters 6D, 6E, and 6K, and rules adopted thereunder,
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    shall be guilty of a petty misdemeanor and, upon conviction,
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    shall be fined not more than $500 or be imprisoned not more than
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    thirty days, or both.
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         If any person fails to comply with a summons or citation
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    issued, or if any person fails or refuses to deposit bail as
5
    required and within the time permitted, the officers shall cause
6
    a complaint to be entered against the person and secure the
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    issuance of a warrant for the person's arrest.
8
              When a complaint is made to any prosecuting officer of
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    the violation of title 12, chapters 6D, 6E, and 6K, and rules
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    adopted thereunder, the officer who issued the summons or
11
    citation shall subscribe to it under oath administered by
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    another official or officials of the department of [land and
13
    natural resources] public safety whose names have been submitted
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    to the prosecuting officer and who have been designated by the
15
    [chairperson of the board of land and natural resources]
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    director of public safety to administer [the same.] oaths."

         SECTION 4. Section 199-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    amended as follows:
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         1. By amending subsection (a) to read:
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         "(a) Any police officer or agent of the department of
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    [land and natural resources] public safety upon whom the [board
22
    of land and natural resources] director of public safety has
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- 1 conferred powers of police officers, shall have the authority to
- 2 conduct searches on probable cause as provided by law and to
- 3 seize any equipment, article, instrument, aircraft, vehicle,
- 4 vessel, business records, or natural resource used or taken in
- 5 violation of the provisions contained in chapters 6D, 6E, and
- 6 6K, or title 12, or any rules adopted thereunder. For purposes
- 7 of this section, "natural resource" includes any archaeological
- 8 artifacts, minerals, any aquatic life or wildlife or parts
- 9 thereof, including their eggs, and any land plants or parts
- 10 thereof, including seeds."
- 11 2. By amending subsections (c) and (d) to read:
- "(c) The department of [land and natural resources] public
- 13 safety shall compile a list of all equipment, articles,
- 14 instruments, aircraft, vehicles, vessels, or any natural
- 15 resource forfeited as provided in this section and shall publish
- 16 the list in its annual report.
- 17 (d) Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, the
- 18 department of [land and natural resources] public safety may
- 19 sell or take actions to cause the sale of any perishable natural
- 20 resource that is seized to prevent the waste of the natural
- 21 resource and to ensure the economic value of [such] the natural
- resource; provided that the department may not sell or cause the SB1315 SD1.DOC

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    sale of any threatened or endangered species or any other
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    species whose sale is prohibited by law. The department of
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    [land and natural resources] public safety may require the
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    person or persons who took the natural resources to sell the
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    seized natural resources at fair market value. The department
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    of [land and natural resources] public safety may require any
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    person purchasing any seized natural resource to deliver the

    proceeds of the sale to the department of [land and natural
9
    resources] public safety or its authorized representative. Any
10
    person who refuses to sell the seized natural resources at fair
11
    market value or any person who fails to deliver the proceeds of
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    the sale, as directed by the department of [land and natural
13
    resources, public safety shall be in violation of this
14
    subsection and punishable as provided by law. The department of
15
    [land and natural resources] public safety shall deposit and
16
    keep the proceeds of the sale in an interest bearing account
17
    until such time as the suspected violation is settled between
18
    the person or persons who took the natural resource, consignee
19
    or consignees, if any, and the department of [land and natural
20
    resources.] public safety. Should a settlement not be reached,
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    the department of [land and natural resources] public safety
22
    shall submit the proceeds of the sale to the court.
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    proceeds of the sale, after deducting any reasonable costs of
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    the sale incurred by the department of [land and natural
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    resources, public safety shall be subject to any administrative
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    or judicial proceedings in the same manner as the seized natural
5
    resource would have been, including an action in rem for the
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    forfeiture of the proceeds. Seizure and sale of a natural

    resource is without prejudice to any other remedy or sanction
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    authorized by law."
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         SECTION 5. Section 199D-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

         "(a) There is established, within the department of [<del>land</del>
12
    and natural resources, public safety a civil natural resource
13
    violations system, whose purpose shall be to process violations
14
    of departmental regulations for which administrative penalties
15
    have been authorized by law or rules adopted thereunder."
16
         SECTION 6. Section 199-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    repealed.
18
         ["$199-2 Board of land and natural resources, delegation
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    of authority. The board of land and natural resources may
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    delegate to enforcement officers within the conservation and
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resources enforcement program, such authority as may be required

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    for enforcement of title 12, chapters 6D, 6E, and 6K, and rules
2
    adopted thereunder."
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         SECTION 7. All administrative rules adopted by the board
4
    of land and natural resources relating to chapter 199, Hawaii
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    Revised Statutes, shall be deemed to be in effect under the
6
    department of public safety as of the effective date of this Act
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    until such time as these rules are amended or repealed by the
8
    director of public safety; provided that the director of public
9
    safety may adopt rules as provided under section 353C-2, Hawaii
10
    Revised Statutes.
         SECTION 8. All rights, powers, functions, and duties of
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    the department of land and natural resources, conservation and
13
    resources enforcement division, are transferred to the
14
    department of public safety.
15
         All officers and employees whose functions are transferred
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    by this Act shall be transferred with their functions and shall
    continue to perform their regular duties upon their transfer,
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18
    subject to the state personnel laws and this Act.
19
         No officer or employee of the State having tenure shall
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    suffer any loss of salary, seniority, prior service credit,
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    vacation, sick leave, or other employee benefit or privilege as
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    a consequence of this Act, and the officer or employee may be
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    transferred or appointed to a civil service position without the
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    necessity of examination; provided that the officer or employee
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    possesses the minimum qualifications for the position to which
    transferred or appointed; and provided that subsequent changes
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5
    in status may be made pursuant to applicable civil service and
6
    compensation laws.
7
         An officer or employee of the State who does not have
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    tenure and who may be transferred or appointed to a civil
9
    service position as a consequence of this Act shall become a
10
    civil service employee without the loss of salary, seniority,
11
    prior service credit, vacation, sick leave, or other employee
12
    benefits or privileges and without the necessity of examination;
13
    provided that the officer or employee possesses the minimum
14
    qualifications for the position to which transferred or
15
    appointed.
16
         If an office or position held by an officer or employee
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    having tenure is abolished, the officer or employee shall not
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    thereby be separated from public employment, but shall remain in
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    the employment of the State with the same pay and classification
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and shall be transferred to some other office or position for

which the officer or employee is eligible under the personnel

- 1 laws of the State as determined by the head of the department or
- 2 the governor.
- 3 SECTION 9. All appropriations, records, equipment,
- 4 machines, files, supplies, contracts, books, papers, documents,
- 5 maps, and other personal property heretofore made, used,
- 6 acquired, or held by the department of land and natural
- 7 resources, conservation and resources enforcement division,
- 8 relating to the functions transferred to the department of
- 9 public safety shall be transferred with the functions to which
- 10 they relate.
- 11 SECTION 10. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 12 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 13 SECTION 11. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
