A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE LAW ENFORCEMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by 2 adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read 3 as follows: 4 "CHAPTER DEPARTMENT OF STATE LAW ENFORCEMENT 5 6 -A Definitions. As used in this chapter: "Department" means the department of state law enforcement. 7 "Director" means the director of state law enforcement. 8 9 -B Establishment of department; composition. (a) 10 There is established the department of state law enforcement. 11 The department shall consist of the authority, (b) functions, and services hereto exercised by the: 12 13 (1) Narcotics enforcement division of the department of 14 public safety; and (2) Sheriff division of the department of public safety. 15 -C Powers and duties of the director. The director 16 17 shall be responsible for the functions and administration of

- 1 programs in the State relating to law enforcement, as provided
- 2 in section -B, not including duties and programs of the
- 3 department of public safety relating to corrections and prisons.
- 4 Laws existing as of July 1, 2011, relating to functions and
- 5 programs under section -B, shall be deemed incorporated under
- 6 this chapter and placed under the jurisdiction of the
- 7 department.
- 8 § -D Deputy directors; appointment. The director shall
- 9 appoint, without regard to chapter 76, deputy directors to
- 10 serve at the director's pleasure.
- 11 § -E Rulemaking powers. The department shall adopt
- 12 rules pursuant to chapter 91 necessary for purposes of this
- 13 chapter; provided that as of July 1, 2011, rules relating to the
- 14 narcotics enforcement division of the department of public
- 15 safety and the sheriff division of the department of public
- 16 safety, as adopted by the respective departments, shall be
- 17 deemed in effect and shall be amended accordingly to reflect
- 18 appropriately the term "department of state law enforcement", as
- 19 applicable."
- 20 SECTION 2. Chapter 26, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
- 21 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to

13	the administration of these programs, the director may:
14	[(1) Preserve the public peace, prevent crime, detect and
15	arrest offenders against the law, protect the rights
16	of persons and property, and enforce and prevent
17	violation of all laws and administrative rules of the
18	State as the director deems to be necessary or
19	desirable or upon request, to assist other state
20	officers or agencies that have primary administrative
21	responsibility over specific subject matters or

15	amended to read as follows:

17	director shall appoint, without regard to chapter 76, [three]
18	two deputy directors to serve at the director's pleasure.
19	Unless otherwise assigned by the director, one deputy director
20	shall oversee the correctional programs and facilities of the
21	department. [one deputy director shall oversee the law

1 enforcement programs of the department, and one deputy director 2 shall oversee administration of the department." 3 SECTION 8. The revisor of statutes shall assign the 4 appropriate section numbers to the letter designations in 5 section 1 of this Act. 6 SECTION 9. All laws and parts of laws heretofore enacted 7 which are in conflict with the provisions of this Act are hereby 8 amended to conform herewith. All acts passed during the regular 9 session of 2009, whether enacted before or after passage of this 10 Act, shall be amended to conform to this Act, unless the Acts 11 specifically provide for the Act relating to the "department of 12 public safety" as being amended. Amendments made to sections of 13 the Hawaii Revised Statutes that are amended by this Act as of a 14 future effective date shall include amendments made after the approval of this Act and before the effective date of the 15 16 amendments made by this Act, to the extent that the intervening 17 amendments may be harmonized with the amendments made by this 18 Act. 19 All rights, powers, functions, and duties of SECTION 10. 20 the narcotics enforcement division of the department of public

safety and sheriff division of the department of public safety

are transferred to the department of state law enforcement.

1 All officers and employees whose functions are transferred 2 by this Act shall be transferred with their functions and shall 3 continue to perform their regular duties upon their transfer, 4 subject to the state personnel laws and this Act. 5 No officer or employee of the State having tenure shall 6 suffer any loss of salary, seniority, prior service credit, 7 vacation, sick leave, or other employee benefit or privilege as 8 a consequence of this Act, and such officer or employee may be 9 transferred or appointed to a civil service position without the 10 necessity of examination; provided that the officer or employee 11 possesses the minimum qualifications for the position to which 12 transferred or appointed; and provided that subsequent changes 13 in status may be made pursuant to applicable civil service and 14 compensation laws. 15 An officer or employee of the State who does not have 16 tenure and who may be transferred or appointed to a civil service position as a consequence of this Act shall become a 17 18 civil service employee without the loss of salary, seniority, 19 prior service credit, vacation, sick leave, or other employee 20 benefits or privileges and without the necessity of examination; 21 provided that such officer or employee possesses the minimum

- 1 qualifications for the position to which transferred or
- 2 appointed.
- If an office or position held by an officer or employee
- 4 having tenure is abolished, the officer or employee shall not
- 5 thereby be separated from public employment, but shall remain in
- 6 the employment of the State with the same pay and classification
- 7 and shall be transferred to some other office or position for
- 8 which the officer or employee is eligible under the personnel
- 9 laws of the State as determined by the head of the department or
- 10 the governor.
- 11 SECTION 11. All appropriations, records, equipment,
- 12 machines, files, supplies, contracts, books, papers, documents,
- 13 maps, and other personal property heretofore made, used,
- 14 acquired, or held by the narcotics enforcement division of the
- 15 department of public safety and sheriff division of the
- 16 department of public safety relating to the functions
- 17 transferred to the department of state law enforcement shall be
- 18 transferred with the functions to which they relate.
- 19 SECTION 12. The sheriff division of the department of
- 20 public safety shall develop a complete organizational and budget
- 21 plan for the implementation and operation of the department of
- 22 state law enforcement, as provided in section 1 of this Act, for



- 1 submission to the legislature by no later than twenty days prior
- 2 to the convening of the regular session of 2010, for purposes of
- 3 the state budget for fiscal year 2011-2012.
- 4 SECTION 13. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 5 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 6 SECTION 14. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2011;
- 7 provided that section 12 shall take effect on July 1, 2009.
