A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTHCARE.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the practice of respiratory care in Hawaii affects the public health, safety, 2 and welfare of people in the State. Accordingly, the practice 3 4 of respiratory care should be subject to regulation and control 5 in order to protect the public from the unqualified practice of 6 respiratory care and from unprofessional conduct by persons 7 licensed to practice respiratory care. 8 The legislature further finds that the practice of 9 respiratory care is a dynamic and changing science, the practice 10 of which continues to evolve with more sophisticated techniques 11 and clinical modalities in patient care. 12 The purpose of this Act is to regulate the practice of 13 respiratory care by establishing a state respiratory care board 14 and licensure requirements. 15 SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new chapter to title 25 to be appropriately designated 16

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1 (6) The transcription and implementation of the written 2 and verbal orders of a physician pertaining to the 3 practice of respiratory care. 4 -2 Limitations of respiratory care practitioner S 5 **license.** Nothing in this chapter shall be construed as 6 authorizing a respiratory care practitioner to practice medicine 7 or perform surgery or any other form of healing except as 8 authorized by the sections of this chapter. 9 -3 License required. No person without a license as a S 10 respiratory care practitioner shall use the title "respiratory 11 care practitioner," or like title, or perform the duties of a 12 respiratory care practitioner; provided that this chapter shall 13 not prohibit any practice of respiratory therapy that is an 14 integral part of a program of study for students enrolled in an 15 accredited respiratory therapy program. 16 -4 Powers and duties of the director. In addition to S 17 any other powers and duties authorized by law, the director

7		to fees for original licensure, renewal, and license

3 § -6 Qualifications for license. Notwithstanding any
4 other law to the contrary, an individual shall meet the
5 following requirements in order to qualify for a respiratory
6 care license:
7 (1) Apply in writing on a form prescribed by the

- 10 (2) Successfully complete a respiratory care training
 11 program approved by the American Association for
 12 Respiratory Care;

13 (3) Pass a background check that shall include a review of
14 the applicant's respiratory care practitioner
15 licensure history in other jurisdictions, including a
16 review of any alleged misconduct or neglect in the
17 practice of respiratory care on the part of the

18 applicant; and

4	revoke, s	uspend, deny, or refuse to renew a license, place a	
5	licensee	on probation, or issue a letter of admonition upon	
6	proof that the licensee:		
7	(1)	Has procured or attempted to procure a license by	
8		fraud, deceit, misrepresentation, misleading omission,	
9		or material misstatement of fact;	
10	(2)	Has been convicted of a felony as provided under	
11		section 701-107;	
12	(3)	Has wilfully or negligently acted in a manner	
13		inconsistent with the health or safety of persons	
14		under the individual's care;	
15	(4)	Has had a license to practice respiratory care or any	
16		other health care occupation suspended or revoked, or	
17		has otherwise been subject to discipline relating to	
18		the individual's practice of respiratory care, in any

20	(5)	Has committed a fraudulent insurance act;	
21	(6)	Excessively or habitually uses alcohol or drugs;

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1 individual under this paragraph if the individual is 2 enrolled in a substance abuse program approved by the 3 department; or 4 Has a physical or mental disability that renders the (7) 5 individual incapable of safely administering 6 respiratory care services. 7 If an allegation of conduct described in subsection (b) 8 (a) is made against a licensee, the respiratory care 9 practitioner board shall conduct an investigation pursuant to 10 section 92-17. (c) In addition to suspension, revocation, denial, or 11 12 refusal to renew a license, the director shall fine a person 13 found to have violated any provision of this chapter or any rule 14 adopted by the director under this chapter not less than \$100 15 nor more than \$1,000 for each violation." 16 SECTION 3. Section 26H-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 17 amended to read as follows: 18 "§26H-6 New regulatory measures. 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1	the best interest for certain health care professions to be
2	licensed for participation in federal programs. Referral shall
3	be by concurrent resolution that identifies a specific

7	consistent with the policies set forth in section 26H-2. The
8	analysis also shall assess alternative forms of regulation. The
9	auditor shall submit each report of analysis to the
10	legislature."
