# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLE NOISE.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 291, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"§291- Operation of radios or other mechanical
5	soundmaking devices or instruments in vehicles; mufflers;
6	exemptions. (a) It is unlawful for any person operating or
7	occupying a motor vehicle on a street or highway to operate or
8	amplify the sound produced by a radio, tape player, or other
9	mechanical soundmaking device or instrument from within the
10	motor vehicle so that the sound is:
11	(1) Plainly audible at a distance of twenty-five feet or
12	more from the motor vehicle; or
13	(2) Louder than necessary for the convenient hearing by
14	persons inside the vehicle in areas adjoining
15	churches, schools, or hospitals.
16	(b) This section shall not apply to any law enforcement
17	motor vehicle equipped with any communication device necessary

- 1 in the performance of law enforcement duties or to any emergency
- 2 vehicle equipped with any communication device necessary in the
- 3 performance of any emergency procedures.
- 4 (c) This section shall not apply to motor vehicles used
- 5 for emergency purposes.
- 6 (d) This section shall not apply to the noise made by a
- 7 horn or other warning device that is equipped on the motor
- 8 vehicle.
- 9 (e) The penalty for a driver or occupant of a motor
- 10 vehicle for violation of this section shall be a fine of \$300.
- 11 (f) As used in this section:
- "Motor vehicles" means motor vehicles, mopeds, motor
- 13 scooters, and motorcycles, as those terms are defined in section
- 14 291C-1. The term "motor vehicles" includes muffler, as defined
- 15 in section 291-24.
- 16 "Plainly audible" means any sound that can be detected by a
- 17 person using unaided hearing faculties. For example, if the
- 18 sound source is a portable or personal vehicular sound
- 19 amplification or reproduction device, the enforcement officer
- 20 need not determine the title of a song, specific words, or the
- 21 artist performing the song. The detection of the rhythmic bass
- 22 component of the music is sufficient to constitute a plainly

- 1 audible sound. In the case of mufflers, the term "plainly
- 2 audible" means unnecessary or unusual noise at a distance of
- 3 twenty-five feet or more from the motor vehicle in a residential
- 4 neighborhood."
- 5 SECTION 2. Section 291-24, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 6 amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows:
- 7 "(c) For purposes of enforcement of this section, section
- 8 291- shall apply. Whoever violates this section shall be
- 9 fined [not more than \$100.] as provided under section
- **10** 291- (e)."
- 11 SECTION 3. Section 291-24.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 12 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
- "(b) For purposes of enforcement of this section, section
- 14 291- shall apply. Any violation of this section shall
- 15 constitute a violation and shall be enforceable by police
- 16 officers. [The fine for this violation shall be not less than
- 17 \$25 nor more than \$250 for each separate offense.] Whoever
- 18 violates this section shall be fined as provided under section
- 19 291- (e). Any person who violates the provisions of this
- 20 section may be issued a summons or citation for [such] the
- 21 violation."

- 1 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 2 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 3 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2009.
