### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. In 2001, the legislature transferred
2	responsibility for licensing teachers from the department of
3	education to the Hawaii teacher standards board. The transfer
4	was based on recommendations from the Hawaii Policy Group of the
5	National Commission on Teaching and America's Future, a national
6	organization with twenty-three partner states, including Hawaii.
7	By authorizing the board to assume responsibility for teacher
8	licensing, the legislature sought to strengthen the teaching
9	profession by making the board self-governing and accountable
10	for teachers who obtain and maintain licenses in Hawaii. Like
11	its professional counterparts, such as the board of medical
12	examiners for doctors, the Hawaii teacher standards board was
13	authorized to issue, renew, revoke, suspend, and reinstate
14	licenses for individuals desiring to teach in our State.
15	During its first six years of operation, the board
16	discovered that its statutory powers and duties needed
17	clarification. Specifically, the board's power to suspend its
18	policies, rules, and standards needed to be clarified. These SB LRB 09-0937.doc

1 clarifications were accomplished in 2007, when the legislature 2 enacted Act 263, Session Laws of Hawaii 2007. The enactment of 3 Act 263 inadvertently removed the board's power to adopt, amend, 4 repeal, or suspend its policies and standards. One of the 5 purposes of this Act is to return those powers to the board. 6 The Act also amends statutory provisions related to the 7 collection of license fees. This Act enables the board to 8 determine how it collects license fees to ensure the timely 9 receipt of the fees and to amend certain fees and set or amend 10 other charges, in accordance with chapter 92. 11 SECTION 2. Section 302A-803, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 12 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 13 In addition to establishing standards for the 14 issuance and renewal of licenses and any other powers and duties 15 authorized by law, the board's powers shall also include: **16** Setting and administering its own budget; (1)17 Adopting, amending, or repealing the rules of the (2) 18 board in accordance with chapter 91; **19** Receiving grants or donations from private (3)20 foundations, and state and federal funds;

2		every five years of the board's accomplishment of
3		objectives, efforts to improve or maintain teacher
4		quality, and efforts to keep its operations responsive

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### Report Title:

Hawaii Teacher Standards Board

### Description:

Authorizes the Hawaii teacher standards board to suspend its policies, rules, and standards when required by extenuating circumstances. Authorizes the board to determine how it collects license fees.
