## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO RENEWABLE ENERGY.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. In 2002, the legislature recognized that:
2	(1)	There is a widespread shortage of petroleum and its
3		derivatives that has caused severe economic hardships
4		throughout the State of Hawaii and threatens to impair
5		the public health, safety, and welfare;
6	(2)	The current energy crisis is caused by a global energy
7		shortage that will worsen through the remainder of
8		this decade; and
9	(3)	The State of Hawaii, with its near total dependence on
10		imported fossil fuel for energy, is particularly
11		vulnerable to dislocations in the global energy
12		market.
13	Th <sub>e</sub>	environmental challenges confronting Hawaii and the
14	global com	mmunity have increased and overwhelming consumption of
15	fossil fu	el continues to threaten the human population and the
16	earth's very survival. The wisest response to this impending	
17	crisis is to select courses of action that allow economic	
18	expansion	while minimizing harm to the environment.



- 1 As there are few places in the world as generously endowed 2 with natural, non-polluting power sources as Hawaii, clearly, 3 the deployment of renewable energy resources, such as solar 4 thermal energy, should be aggressively pursued whenever 5 economically feasible. The benefits of such a pursuit include: 6 (1)Adding clean energy to the State's resources; 7 Reducing risk by diversifying the State's energy (2) 8 portfolio; 9 (3) Mainstreaming solar power development, improving its 10 technology, and increasing its affordability; and Establishing Hawaii as a world-class solar market. 11 (4)**12** The purpose of this Act is to direct each county to require 13 the installation of solar thermal energy systems in new 14 residential developments. 15 SECTION 2. Chapter 46, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended 16 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to 17 read as follows: 18 "§46- Residential solar thermal energy systems. (a) 19 By January 1, 2010, each county shall incorporate into its 20 building code a requirement that solar thermal energy systems be 21 installed in new developments with six or more: 22 (1) Single-family dwellings; or
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1	(2) Multi-family residential units.		
2	All plans and specifications submitted with or in connection		
3	with an application for a building or construction permit shall		
4	bear the certification by a registered architect or engineer		
5	that the plans and specifications comply with this requirement.		
6	(b) For purposes of this section, "solar thermal energy		
7	system" means any identifiable facility, equipment, apparatus,		
8	or the like, including a photovoltaic cell application, that is		
9	applicable to a single-family or multi-family residential unit		
10	and makes use of solar energy for heating, cooling, or reducing		
11	the use of other types of energy dependent upon fossil fuel for		
12	generation; provided that "solar thermal energy system" shall		
13	not include skylights or windows."		
14	SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that		
15	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were		
16	begun, before its effective date.		
17	SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.		
18	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
