RELATING TO FISHING.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 188-40.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "[+]\$188-40.5[+] [Sharks; Shark fins; prohibitions; 4 administrative penalties. (a) No person shall knowingly 5 [<del>harvest</del>]: 6 Harvest shark fins from the territorial waters of the (1)7 State[ , or land]; 8 Import into the State shark fins harvested from (2) 9 outside the territorial waters of the State; 10 (3) Land shark fins in the State  $[\tau]$ ; or 11 Have custody, control, or possession of any shark fin; (4)12 unless the fins were taken from a shark landed whole in the 13 State. 14 (b) Any person violating this section or any rule adopted 15 thereunder shall be subject to: 16 (1) Seizure and forfeiture of shark fins, commercial **17** marine license, vessel, and fishing equipment; and

### Report Title:

Fishing; Sharks; Finning

### Description:

Prohibits importation to the State or possession of shark fins unless the fins were taken from a shark landed whole in the State. Applies prohibition to any vessel stopping to refuel or offload cargo or otherwise in transit through waters of the State. Establishes presumption regarding possession of shark fins not attached to the carcass.
