A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC SCHOOL CAFETERIA WORKERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that cafeteria workers
 employed in public schools are currently employed for a
 twelve-month period, cafeteria managers are employed for a
 ten-month period, and school meals are provided over a ten-month
 period.

6 The purpose of this Act is to clarify that cafeteria
7 workers employed after July 1, 2009, shall be compensated for a
8 school-year period with the compensation prorated over a
9 calendar-year period.

10 SECTION 2. Section 302A-637, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 11 amended to read as follows:

12 "\$302A-637 Cafeteria workers. All cafeteria workers 13 employed in the department shall be employed and have their 14 compensation adjusted in accordance with chapter 76 and the 15 appropriate collective bargaining agreement, executive order, 16 executive directive, or rule, and the monthly rates of basic 17 compensation so determined shall be payable for employment:
