# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

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#### PART I

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii's children
deserve a quality education in a clean and safe environment.
Many schools have leaky roofs, termite-infested floors,
crumbling walls, and overheated classrooms. The legislature
further finds that there is a compelling need to immediately
fund the backlog of repair and maintenance projects in the
public schools.

9 In 2001, the legislature appropriated funds to help 10 mitigate the department of education's estimated \$640,000,000 11 backlog of repair and maintenance projects. In 2007, the 12 estimated backlog of repair and maintenance projects was 13 \$341,000,000, which included recurring major and minor repairs, 14 ongoing cycle maintenance, service and contract maintenance, 15 nonrecurring projects, and emergency repairs. Unfortunately, 16 due in part to the governor's decision not to release 17 \$140,000,000 previously approved by the legislature during past

legislative sessions for repair and maintenance projects of the
 department of education, the backlog remains and continues to
 increase. Since last year, the backlog has increased to
 approximately \$421,000,000, and is expected to increase by an
 additional \$75,000,000 during the upcoming fiscal year.

6 It is the intent of the legislature to reduce the backlog 7 of repair and maintenance projects within the public schools to 8 a manageable level. To meet this objective, this Act authorizes 9 the issuance of general obligation bonds and appropriates 10 \$155,000,000 annually through fiscal year 2012 for repair and 11 maintenance projects of the department of education. At the 12 rate of \$155,000,000 annually, the backlog will be reduced after 13 three years, as follows:

1 SECTION 2. The director of finance is authorized to issue 2 general obligation bonds in the sum of \$ or so much 3 thereof as may be necessary and the same sum or so much thereof 4 as may be necessary is appropriated for fiscal year 2009-2010 5 for the purpose of funding the department of education's repair 6 and maintenance projects. 7 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 8 education for the purposes of this part. 9 SECTION 3. The director of finance is authorized to issue 10 general obligation bonds in the sum of \$ or so much 11 thereof as may be necessary and the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary is appropriated for fiscal year 2010-2011 12 13 for the purpose of funding the department of education's repair 14 and maintenance projects. 15 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 16 education for the purposes of this part. 17 SECTION 4. The appropriations made for the capital 18 improvement projects authorized by this part shall not lapse at 19 the end of the fiscal biennium for which the appropriation is 20 made; provided that all moneys from the appropriations in 21 section 2 and 3 unencumbered as of June 30, 2012, shall lapse as 22 of that date.

2	SECTION 5. The purpose of this part is to provide a
3	temporary exemption from chapter 103 and 103D, Hawaii Revised
4	Statutes, to the department of education in order to expedite
5	construction projects.
6	SECTION 6. (a) Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes,
7	notwithstanding, the department of education shall not be
8	subject to chapter 103 and 103D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and
9	any and all other requirements of law for competitive bidding
10	for contracts related to construction projects; provided that
11	the department shall develop internal policies and procedures
12	for the procurement of goods and services relating to
13	construction projects, consistent with the goals of public
14	accountability and public procurement practices.
15	(b) The department shall submit annual reports to the
16	legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
17	the regular sessions of 2010 through 2013 on the status of the
18	construction projects utilizing the exemptions established in
19	subsection (a).

21	SECTION 7. If any provision of this Act, or the

invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or
 applications of the Act, which can be given effect without the
 invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions
 of this Act are severable.
 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2090, and

6 the exemptions granted in section 6 of this Act shall be

7 repealed on June 30, 2012.
