A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD CHECKS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 302A-601.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended to read as follows:

3 "[+]\$302A-601.5[+] Employees of the department of 4 education [and], teacher trainees, and volunteers in any public 5 school; criminal history record checks. (a) The department of 6 education, including the Hawaii state public library system, 7 shall develop procedures for obtaining verifiable information 8 regarding the criminal history of persons who are employed or 9 seeking employment in any position, including teacher 10 trainees $[\tau]$ and volunteers, that places them in close proximity 11 to children. These procedures shall include criminal history 12 record checks in accordance with section 846-2.7.

13 Information obtained pursuant to this subsection shall be 14 used exclusively by the employer or prospective employer for the 15 purpose of determining whether a person is suitable for working 16 or volunteering in close proximity to children. All such

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1	decisions	shall be subject to applicable federal laws and
2	regulation	ns currently or hereafter in effect.
3	(b)	The employer or prospective employer may refuse to
4	$employ[_{r}]$	or accept a volunteer and may:
5	(1)	Refuse to issue a teaching or other educational
6		certificate;
7	(2)	Revoke the teaching or other educational certificate;
8	(3)	Refuse to allow or continue to allow teacher training;
9		[or]
10	(4)	Terminate the employment of any employee or deny
11		employment to an applicant $[\tau]$; or
12	(5)	Terminate or refuse the services of any volunteer,
13	if the pe	rson has been convicted of a crime, and if the employer
14	or prospe	ctive employer finds by reason of the nature and
15	circumstances of the crime that the person poses a risk to the	
16	health, safety, or well-being of children. Refusal, revocation,	
17	or termination may occur only after appropriate investigation	
18	and notification to the employee or applicant for employment or	
19	a volunteer position of results and planned action, and after	
20	the employee or applicant for employment or the volunteer	
21	position is given an opportunity to meet and rebut the finding.	
22	Nothing in this subsection shall abrogate any applicable appeal	
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1 rights under [chapters] chapter 76 or 89, or administrative 2 regulation of the department of education. 3 This section shall not be used by the department to (C) 4 secure criminal history record checks on persons who have been 5 employed continuously by the department, including the state 6 public library system, on a salaried basis prior to July 1, 7 1990. 8 Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, for (d) 9 purposes of this section, the department of education, including 10 the Hawaii state public library system, shall be exempt from 11 section 831-3.1 and need not conduct investigations, 12 notifications, or hearings under this section in accordance with 13 chapter 91. 14 (e) For the purposes of this section: 15 "Volunteer" means any individual who provides, or intends 16 to provide, direct services, assistance, or supervision, to 17 students on a non-compensatory basis." 18 SECTION 2. Section 846-2.7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 19 amended to read as follows: 20 "§846-2.7 Criminal history record checks. 11	(2)	Identifying information required by the Federal Bureau

13		limited to name, date of birth, height, weight, eye
14		color, hair color, gender, race, and place of birth;

16	(3)	A statement indicating whether the applicant or
17		employee has ever been convicted of a crime."

19	establish	and maintain a criminal history data base utilizing
20	the state	and national screening information collected by the
21	department	t, which shall be available to all public schools and

(b) The department of education may determine the scope of
 the criminal history information required for employees and
 volunteers, and if appropriate, may limit the scope of the
 criminal history check of volunteers to only those volunteers
 who may have regular contact with children.
