A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FOOD WASTE RECYCLING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that waste disposal is an 2 issue of critical importance throughout the islands. Section 226-15, Hawaii Revised Statutes, declares that "it shall be the 3 4 policy of this State to . . . [p]romote re-use and recycling to 5 reduce solid and liquid wastes and employ a conservation ethic." 6 The legislature further finds that state facilities and 7 public schools are among the largest institutional sources of food waste, in spite of current recycling efforts. - 16 the integrated solid waste management plans under chapter 342G,
- 17 Hawaii Revised Statutes.

- 1 The purpose of this Act is to establish a three-year pilot
- 2 project in one or more schools, to be selected by the department
- 3 of education, in partnership with the department of health, for
- 4 recycling food waste as part of the State's integrated solid
- 5 waste management plans under chapter 342G, Hawaii Revised
- 6 Statutes.
- 7 SECTION 2. (a) The department of education, in
- 8 partnership with the department of health, shall develop and
- 9 implement a three-year food waste recycling pilot project in one
- 10 or more schools that is in accordance with chapter 342G, Hawaii
- 11 Revised Statutes.
- 12 The program sites shall be determined by the department of
- 13 education and shall be the sites most suitable in meeting the
- 14 objectives of the pilot project.
- 15 The department of health shall cooperate with the
- 16 department of education to develop and implement the components
- 17 of the pilot project.
- (b) In developing and implementing the pilot project, the
- 19 department of education and the department of health shall
- 20 consider using public-private partnerships and are encouraged to
- 21 seek and use public-private sector funding support.

- 1 (c) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the
- 2 department of education and the department of health may accept
- 3 and expend private monetary donations to develop and operate the
- 4 pilot project required by this section.
- 5 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 6 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 7 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2009-2010 and
- 8 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 9 year 2010-2011 to develop and implement a three-year food waste
- 10 recycling pilot project in one or more public schools.
- 11 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 12 of education for the purposes of this Act.
- 13 SECTION 4. The department of education, with the
- 14 assistance of the department of health, shall submit interim
- 15 reports on the pilot project to the legislature no later than
- 16 twenty days prior to the convening of the regular sessions of
- 17 2010 and 2011, and a final report to the legislature no later
- 18 than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session
- 19 of 2012. The reports shall include information and
- 20 recommendations about the efficacy of and the costs associated
- 21 with the food waste recycling pilot project. The final report

- 1 shall also include a recommendation on whether the food waste
- 2 recycling pilot project should be made permanent.
- 3 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020, and
- 4 shall be repealed on June 30, 2012.

Description:

Requires the department of education, in a partnership with the department of health, to establish a three-year food waste recycling pilot project in one or more public schools. Allows departments to enter into public/private partnerships to establish and operate the pilot program. Appropriates funds for the pilot program. Takes effect July 1, 2020. (SB178 HD1)
