### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEARING AID DEVICES.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. According to the Mayo Clinic, an estimated
 one-quarter of Americans between the ages of sixty-five and
 seventy-five and around three-quarters of those older than
 seventy-five have some degree of hearing loss. According to a
 study by the Better Hearing Institute, untreated hearing loss
 cut household income by an average of nearly \$23,000 per year.

According to the American Association of Retired Persons, the cost of a custom hearing aid can range as high as \$2,000. Medicare and most private insurance companies do not cover the cost of hearing aids through their base health care coverage. It is not unusual for people with hearing loss to know that hearing aids are expensive and are not covered by insurance so they choose not to purchase them.

14 The purpose of this Act is to require that the cost of 15 hearing aids be covered by private health insurers.

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1	SECTION 2. Chapter 431:10A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"§431:10A- Hearing aid devices; notice. (a) Any other
5	law to the contrary notwithstanding, each health policy,
6	contract, plan, or agreement issued or renewed in this State
7	after December 31, 2009, other than an accident-only, specified
8	disease, hospital indemnity, medicare supplement, long-term
9	care, dental, vision, or other limited benefit health insurance
10	policy, shall provide, not as an employer option, coverage for
11	the cost of hearing aid devices for the policyholder and
12	individuals covered under the policy, contract, plan, or
13	agreement.
14	(b) Coverage required under this section may be subject to
15	deductibles, copayments, coinsurance, or annual or maximum
16	payment limits that are consistent with deductibles, copayments,
17	coinsurance, and annual or maximum payment limits applicable to
18	other similar coverage under the policy, contract, plan, or
19	agreement.
20	(c) Every insurer shall provide notice to its
21	policyholders regarding the coverage required by this section.

1	literature or correspondence sent to policyholders and shall be
2	transmitted to policyholders within calendar year 2009 when
3	annual information is made available to policyholders, or in any
4	other mailing to policyholders, but in no case later than
5	December 31, 2009."
6	SECTION 3. Chapter 432, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
7	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
8	and to read as follows:
9	" <b>§432- Hearing aid devices; notice.</b> (a) Any other law
10	to the contrary notwithstanding, each individual and group
11	hospital or medical service plan, policy, contract, or agreement
12	issued or renewed in this State after December 31, 2009, shall
13	provide, not as an employer option, coverage for the cost of
14	hearing aid devices for the member and individuals covered under
15	the individual and group hospital or medical service plan,
16	policy, contract, or agreement.
17	(b) Coverage required under this section may be subject to
18	deductibles, copayments, coinsurance, or annual or maximum
19	payment limits that are consistent with deductibles, copayments,
20	coinsurance, and annual or maximum payment limits applicable to
21	other similar coverage under the individual and group hospital
22	or medical service plan, policy, contract, or agreement.

1	(c) Every mutual benefit society shall provide notice to
2	its members regarding the coverage required by this section.
3	The notice shall be in writing and prominently positioned in any
4	literature or correspondence sent to members and shall be
5	transmitted to members within calendar year 2009 when annual
6	information is made available to policyholders, or in any other
7	mailing to members, but in no case later than December 31,
8	<u>2009.</u> "
9	SECTION 4. Section 432D-23, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
10	amended to read as follows:
11	"§432D-23 Required provisions and benefits.
12	Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, each
13	policy, contract, plan, or agreement issued in the State after
14	January 1, 1995, by health maintenance organizations pursuant to
15	this chapter, shall include benefits provided in sections
16	431:10-212, 431:10A-115, 431:10A-115.5, 431:10A-116,
17	431:10A-116.5, 431:10A-116.6, 431:10A-119, 431:10A-120, [and]
18	431:10A-121, and 431:10A- , and chapter 431M."
