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### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO UTILITIES.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
2	adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
3	as follows:
4	"CHAPTER
5	UTILITIES COORDINATING COUNCIL
6	§ -1 Utilities coordinating council; establishment. (a)
7	There is established a utilities coordinating council to
8	coordinate the orderly planning and installation, removal, or
9	relocation of underground facilities.
10	(b) Notwithstanding section 26-34, the utilities
11	coordinating council shall consist of:
12	(1) The heads of the following agencies or their
13	designees:
14	(A) The department of transportation;
15	(B) The department of land and natural resources:
16	(i) Land division; and
17	(ii) State historic preservation division;



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1		(C) The department of health, environmental
2		management division; and
3		(D) The public utilities commission; and
4	(2)	Two representatives from each participating local
5		utilities coordinating council established under
6		section -3.
7	(c)	The utilities coordinating council shall be placed
8	within th	e department of transportation for administrative
9	purposes.	
10	(d)	Members of the utilities coordinating council shall:
11	(1)	Serve without compensation but shall be reimbursed for
12		reasonable expenses, including travel expenses,
13		necessary for the performance of their duties; and
14	(2)	Elect a chairperson from the membership.
15	S	-2 Utilities coordinating council; responsibilities.
16	(a) The	utilities coordinating council shall:
17	(1)	Identify national best practices for utility
18		coordination;
19	(2)	Develop and implement a project development process to
20	н 	coordinate the orderly planning and installation,
21		removal, or relocation of underground facilities:



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1	(3)	Meet at least quarterly at various locations
2		throughout the State;
3	(4)	Assist and promote the formation of local utility
4		coordinating councils;
5	(5)	Encourage agencies, utilities, contractors, and
6		excavators, not already council members, who are in
7		any way involved in subsurface disturbance to attend
8		local utility coordinating councils meetings; and
9	(6)	Improve the communication among those involved in
10		subsurface disturbance, including agencies, utilities,
11	·	contractors, and excavators.
12	(b)	The utilities coordinating council shall submit an
13	annual re	port to the legislature no later than twenty days prior
14	to the co	nvening of each regular session.
15	S	-3 Local utilities coordinating councils. (a) Local
16	utilities	coordinating councils may be formed in each county and
17	consist o	f representatives of:
18	(1)	The various county agencies involved in subsurface
19		disturbance, including agencies related to
20		maintenance, public works, planning, and permitting;
21	(2)	The gas utility industry;
22	(3)	The electric utility industry;

3	(6)	The cable service industry;
4	(7)	The General Contractor Association of Hawaii; and

. 6	(b)	Members of each local utilities coordinating council
7	shall:	
8	(1)	Serve without compensation; and
9	(2)	Elect two representatives from the membership to serve
10		on the state utilities coordinating council.
11	S	-4 Project development process. (a) All public
12	utilities	in the State shall comply with the project development
13	process.	
14	(b)	The project development process shall:
15	(1)	Emphasize early utility identification and
16		coordination, including greater utility coordination
17		in the design phase;
18	(2)	Seek to resolve any utility coordination issues before
19		construction begins;
20	(3)	Minimize project delays, construction costs, and
21		contractor claims that are associated with subsurface
22		disturbance;
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1	(4)	Clarify the roles and responsibilities of
2		stakeholders;
3	(5)	Provide for the consistent application of procedures;
4		and
5	(6)	Solicit feedback.
6	(c)	As used in this section, "public utility" has the same
7	meaning a	s that term is defined under section 269-1."
8	SECT	ION 2. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2009.
