A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE MAXIMUM TERM OF COMMERCIAL USE AND OPERATOR PERMITS FOR THRILL CRAFT AND PARASAILING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 200-37, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending subsections (m) and (n) to read as follows:
3	"(m) Each commercial use and operator permit issued by the
4	department for commercial thrill craft[$_{ au}$] and parasailing
5	activities shall be valid for [five years] <u>one year</u> from the
6	date of issuance and shall be renewed by the department [for
7	additional five year periods, not to exceed a maximum of twenty
8	years;] <u>annually,</u> provided that the permit holder [shall have
9	met] meets the following conditions:
10	(1) The permit holder shall be in compliance with all
11	applicable rules of the department;
12	(2) The permit holder shall have timely filed and paid all
13	applicable state taxes during the year; and
14	(3) The permit holder shall have a good safety record
15	regarding the operation of a commercial thrill craft,

1	(n) [Upon expiration of the twenty year period, the permit
2	may be offered for public auction as provided in this chapter;
3	provided that the previous permit holder shall be offered-the
4	right-of first refusal in accordance with departmental rules;

6	the highest bid offered at the public auction.] Upon revocation
7	of a permit for failure to meet the conditions for renewal, the
8	department shall offer the permit for public auction."
