## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIREWORKS.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 237, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 2 3 and to read as follows: **Consumer fireworks tax.** (a) There is hereby 4 "§237-5 levied and shall be assessed and collected with each 6 transaction, in addition to any other tax imposed under this 7 chapter and license or fee imposed under chapter 132D, a 8 consumer fireworks tax against wholesalers, as defined in section 237-4(a)(1), of consumer fireworks, as defined in 9 10 section 132D-2, measured by the application of rates against the 11 gross proceeds of sales as provided in subsection (b). 12 Upon every person engaged in the sales of consumer (b) fireworks at wholesale to a retail merchant, jobber, or other 13 licensed seller for purposes of resale consumer fireworks, there 14 15 shall be levied, assessed, and collected a consumer fireworks 16 tax equal to the value of the consumer fireworks, as shown by 17 the gross proceeds derived from the sale thereof by the 18 wholesaler, multiplied by eight per cent.

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1	(c) Beginning January 1, 2011, the consumer fireworks tax
2	shall be paid to the State, in the same manner as the return for
3	the general excise tax under section 237-30(b)(1), in quarterly
4	installments on or before the last day of the calendar month
5	after the close of each quarter in which the taxes accrue, and
6	shall be paid by transmitting the signed return together with
7	the remittance in the manner provided in section 237-31. Annual
8	return and payment of tax under section 237-33 shall apply to
9	this section.
10	(d) Audits, procedures, and penalties under sections 237-
11	39 and 237-32 shall apply to this section.
12	(e) All remittances of taxes imposed by this section shall
13	be deposited into the state treasury as a state realization;
14	provided that per cent of remittances under this section
15	shall be set aside in a separate account to be drawn upon,
16	without appropriation by the legislature, by the department of
17	the attorney general and the department of taxation for
18	implementation and enforcement of this section; provided further
19	that the department of the attorney general and the department
20	of taxation shall coordinate implementation and enforcement so
21	as to minimize duplication of services; and provided further .
22	that the department of the attorney general and the department
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1	of taxation shall report to the logislature prior to the		
, L	of taxation shall report to the legislature prior to the		
2	convening of each regular session on the expenses paid from the		
3	separate account in the year immediately preceding the report."		
4	SECTION 2. Section 132D-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
5	amended by amending the definition of "cultural" to read as		
6	follows:		
7	""Cultural" means relating to the arts, customs,		
8	traditions, mores, and history of all of the various ethnic		
9	groups of Hawaii $[-]$ and includes religious events held in the		
10	State."		
11	SECTION 3. Section 132D-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
12	amended to read as follows:		
13	"\$132D-3 Permissible uses of consumer fireworks. Consumer		
14	fireworks may be set off, ignited, discharged, or otherwise		
15	caused to explode within the State only:		
16	(1) From 9:00 p.m. on New Year's Eve to 1:00 a.m. on New		
17	Year's Day; from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. on Chinese New		
18	Year's Day; and from 1:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. on the		
19	Fourth of July; or		
20	(2) From 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. as allowed by permit		
21	pursuant to section 132D-10 if the proposed cultural		



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1		use is to occur at any time other than during the
2		periods prescribed in paragraph (1)[ $\div$
3	provided	that the purchase of not more than five thousand
4	individua	l-consumer fireworks commonly known as firecrackers
5	shall be	allowed under each permit]."
6	SECT	ION 4. Section 132D-10, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
7	amended t	o read as follows:
8	"§13	<b>2D-10 Permits.</b> (a) A permit shall be required for
9	the purch	ase and use of:
10	(1)	Any consumer fireworks [ <del>commonly known as</del>
11		firecrackers] upon payment of a fee of [ <del>\$25;</del> ]
12		<u>\$    ;</u>
13	(2)	Any aerial devices, display fireworks, or articles
14		pyrotechnic for the purposes of section 132D-16 upon
15		payment of a fee of $[\$110;]$ $\$$ ; and
16	(3)	Any consumer fireworks for the purposes of section
17		132D-5 or for cultural uses that occur at any time
18		other than during the periods prescribed in section
19		132D-3(1) upon a payment of a fee of [ <del>\$25.</del> ]
20		\$
21	<u>(b)</u>	Only one permit shall be issued per person under
22	subsectio	n (a)(1) or (a)(3) and the purchase of not more than
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1	five thousand individual consumer fireworks commonly known as
2	firecrackers shall be allowed for each permit issued.
3	(c) Fees collected under this section shall be credited to
4	the county that collected the fee to defray expenses associated
5	with enforcement of this chapter."
6	SECTION 5. Section 132D-14, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
7	amended by amending subsections (b) and (c) to read as follows:
8	"(b) Except as provided in subsection (a) or as otherwise
9	specifically provided for in this chapter, any person violating
10	any other provision of this chapter, shall be fined not more
11	than $[\$2,000]$ $\$10,000$ for each violation.
12	(c) The court shall collect the fines imposed in
13	subsections (a) and (b) for violating this chapter and [ <del>of the</del> ]
14	shall transfer all fines collected [shall pay twenty per cent to
15	the State and eighty per-cent to the county in which the fine
16	was imposed which shall be expended by the county for law
17	enforcement purposes.] into the general fund."
18	SECTION 6. The department of taxation shall report to the
19	legislature, no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
20	the regular session of 2011, on a plan to impose a tax on retail
21	sales of fireworks, consumer fireworks, aerial devices, articles
22	pyrotechnic, and display fireworks, as those terms are defined
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and used in chapter 132D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, including
proposed legislation.

3 SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed4 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

5 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.



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### Report Title:

Fireworks; Permit Fees; Tax

### Description:

Imposes a consumer fireworks tax at the wholesale level. Clarifies definition of "cultural" to include religious events held in the State. Increases fireworks permit fees. Dedicates fireworks permit fees to counties for law enforcement purposes. Increases fines for violation. Requires department of taxation to report on a plan to impose tax on retail sales of fireworks. Effective 7/1/2050.
