A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CIVIL DEFENSE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 128, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	" <u>§128-</u> Statewide communications interoperability
5	coordinator; establishment; responsibilities. (a) There is
6	established within the civil defense agency the position of
7	statewide communications interoperability coordinator, which
8	shall be a full-time position exempt from chapters 76 and 89.
9	(b) The statewide communications interoperability
10	coordinator shall have the following areas of responsibility:
11	(1) Outreach, which shall include:
12	(A) Establishing and maintaining a database of
13	subject matter experts and stakeholders across
14	the State;
15	(B) Acting as liaison among the federal government,
16	state agencies and officials, and state and
17	county emergency response communities;

19	SECT:	ION 3	. There is appropriated out of the federal funds
20	received w	under	the homeland security grant program the sum of
21	\$110,000	or so	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year

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2010-2011 to fund the statewide communications interoperability
coordinator position established by this Act.
The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
defense for the purposes of this Act.
SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
provided that section 3 shall take effect on July 1, 2010.
