A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII EMPLOYER-UNION HEALTH BENEFITS TRUST FUND BOARD OF TRUSTEES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to add a trustee to
- 2 the board of trustees of the employer-union health benefits
- 3 trust fund to represent the interests of the counties.
- 4 According to the State of Hawaii 2008 Data Book there were
- 5 74,300 state workers and 18,550 county workers. For fiscal year
- 6 2007-2008, the total amount contributed to the employer-union
- 7 health benefits trust fund for health benefit plans was
- 8 \$551,754,581; of this amount \$307,468,074 came from the State,
- 9 \$128,636,434 came from the counties and county water supply
- 10 agencies, and \$115,650,073 was contributed by employees. Of the
- 11 total employer-union health benefits trust fund board
- 12 membership, there are five employer trustees on the board who
- 13 are currently state administration employees, and current law
- 14 does not include a provision for county representation. As
- 15 employers, the counties pay a substantial amount into the
- 16 employer-union health benefits trust fund and should have some
- 17 say on the board of trustees. Recently, decisions have been



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1	made that affect the counties, including the decision to change				
2	the prescription drug program, and have caught members by				
3	surprise. Adding a trustee to the employer-union health				
4	benefits trust fund to represent the counties will ensure				
5	members are better informed of changes to the programs and				
6	decisions are made that will take county interests into				
. 7	consideration.				
8	SECTION 2. Section 87A-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is				
9	amended to read as follows:				
10	§87A-5 Composition of board. The board of trustees of the				
11	employer-union health benefits trust fund shall consist of [ten]				
12	eleven trustees appointed by the governor in accordance with the				
13	following procedure:				
14	(1) Five trustees, one of whom shall represent retirees,				
15	to represent employee-beneficiaries and to be selected				
16	as follows:				
17	(A) Three trustees shall be appointed from a list of				
18	two nominees per trustee selected by each of the				
19	three exclusive representative organizations that				
20	have the largest number of employee-				
21	beneficiaries;				

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1		(B)	One trustee shall be appointed from a list of two
2			nominees selected by mutual agreement of the
3			remaining exclusive employee representative
4			organizations; and
5		(C)	One trustee representing retirees shall be
6			appointed from a list of two nominees selected by
7			mutual agreement of all eligible exclusive
8			representatives; [and]
9	(2)	Five	trustees to represent public employers [-]; and
10	(3)	One	trustee to represent county public employers, to
11		be a	ppointed from a list of two nominees selected by
12		the	Hawaii State Association of Counties or, if that
13		asso	ciation shall cease to exist, by a successor
14		orga	nization composed of the members of the
15		coun	cils of all Hawaii counties excluding the county
16		of K	alawao.
17	Sect	ion 2	6-34 shall not apply to board member selection and
18	terms. No	otwit]	hstanding any other provision of this section, no
19	exclusive	repr	esentative of a bargaining unit that sponsors or
20	participa	tes i	n a voluntary employee beneficiary association
21	shall be	eligi	ble to select nominees or to be represented by a
22	trustee o	n the	board.

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1	As used in this section, the term "exclusive
2	representative" shall have the same meaning as in section 89-2."

4	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
