A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EARLY EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Act 219, Session Laws of Hawaii 2004, launched 2 junior kindergarten beginning with the 2006-2007 school year, 3 with the intent to enable all children in Hawaii to succeed in 4 kindergarten and subsequent school experiences by addressing 5 their varying developmental and learning needs. The legislature 6 finds that thus far, only about one-third of the schools in the 7 state have adopted some variation of the junior kindergarten 8 program.

9 The intent of Act 14, Special Session Laws of Hawaii 2008, 10 which established the State's early learning system known as 11 Keiki First Steps, was to integrate the cohort of children who 12 would otherwise attend junior kindergarten into the system over 13 time, because as the legislature continues to find, these 14 children may be placed more appropriately in a preschool 15 setting. However, the legislature finds that more rapid 16 progress must be made in finding cost-effective methods of providing early education. 17

7 SECTION 2. Section 302A-411, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
8 amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows:

9 "(C) Beginning with the 2004-2005 school year, a child who 10 will be at least five years of age on or before December 31 of 11 the school year may attend a public school kindergarten. 12 Beginning with the 2006-2007 school year, a child who will be at 13 least five years of age on or before August 1 of the school year 14 may attend a public school kindergarten. Beginning with the 15 2006-2007 school year, a child who will be at least five years 16 of age after August 1 and before January 1 of the school year 17 may attend a public school junior kindergarten. Beginning with 18 the 2013-2014 school year, a child who will be at least five 19 years of age on the first day of instruction may attend a public 20 school kindergarten."

21 SECTION 3. The department of education and early learning 22 council shall work together to develop a plan to assess the 2010-2093 SB2068 CD1 SMA.doc
