A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TEACHERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 The legislature finds that with an overall SECTION 1. 2 shortage of teachers and other educational staff members, 3 including administrators and related service professionals, many 4 schools are hard-pressed to keep staff from accepting positions 5 in other schools or leaving the profession altogether. The cost 6 and availability of housing can greatly impact the recruitment 7 and retention of teachers, especially in geographically isolated 8 communities and in schools plaqued with hard-to-fill vacancies. 9 In addition, the high cost of housing in Hawaii creates added 10 economic stress on younger teachers who are among those most 11 likely to leave the profession. The legislature further finds 12 that there is a critical need to provide housing assistance for the recruitment and retention of teachers in hard-to-fill 13 14 positions and geographically isolated public schools, as 15 determined by the department of education.

16 The legislature is also aware that the current condition of 17 state-owned teacher housing mandates that units undergo



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extensive repair and renovation, and will require a consistent
maintenance program and dedicated oversight and support
personnel when the program is transferred from the Hawaii
housing finance and development corporation to the department of
education.

6 The purpose of this Act is to establish a teacher housing 7 allowance program to provide housing assistance to teachers 8 employed in public schools in geographically isolated 9 communities and public schools plagued with hard-to-fill 10 vacancies. This Act also appropriates funds for the repair and maintenance of existing teacher housing and requires the 11 12 department of education to report to the legislature on 13 alternative programs or options for addressing the teacher 14 housing needs in the State.

15 SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 16 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 17 and to read as follows:

18 "<u>§302A- Teacher housing allowance program.</u> (a) The
19 department shall establish a teacher housing allowance program
20 to provide housing allowances to teachers employed to teach at
21 public schools in the State.



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1	(b) The amount of the housing allowance shall be equal to
2	the teacher's full-time equivalence multiplied by the difference
3	between the statewide median cost of housing minus the lesser of
4	either the cost of housing in the school district where the
5	teacher is employed or the cost of housing in the school
6	district in which the teacher resides. For purposes of this
7	section, the difference between the school district's cost of
8	housing and the statewide median shall not exceed fifty per cent
9	of the median.
10	(c) The cost of housing for each school district and the
11	statewide median shall be determined every four years based on a
12	standard set of housing specifications and on data reported for
13	the most recent annual period for which data are available. A
14	nationally recognized entity that collects statistically valid
15	housing cost data for federal government agencies and businesses
16	shall be selected by the superintendent, subject to approval by
17	the board, to collect the data. The department shall contract
18	with the entity selected under this subsection for this purpose.
19	For the purposes of this section, the "statewide median cost of
20	housing" means the cost at which there is an equal number of
21	districts with higher housing costs and with lower housing
22	costs.



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1 (d) The department shall administer the teacher housing 2 allowance program and shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 3 necessary for the program's implementation." SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 4 5 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2009-2010 for 6 7 the teacher housing allowance program established under this 8 Act. 9 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 10 education for the purposes of this Act. 11 There is appropriated out of the general SECTION 4. 12 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 13 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2009-2010 to 14 the department of education for management of the teacher 15 housing program and for renovation, repair, and maintenance 16 costs necessary to bring existing units to acceptable levels of 17 condition. 18 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 19 education for the purposes of this Act. 20 SECTION 5. The department of education shall report to the 21 legislature on various programs and options, including 22 information on the costs, feasibility, and benefits of each SB LRB 09-0738.doc



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1 program or option for addressing the teacher housing needs 2 within the State, no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session of 2010. The programs or 3 4 options examined shall include but not be limited to a second 5 mortgage loan program or other home loan guarantee programs.

SECTION 6. New statutory material is underscored.

7 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval; 8 provided that sections 3 and 4 shall be effective on July 1, 9 2009.

Report Title:

DOE; Teacher Housing Allowance Program; Teacher Housing Repair and Maintenance; Appropriation
