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# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LITTER CONTROL.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 339-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:		
3	"(a) Except as otherwise provided by this chapter, any		
4	person violating any provision of this chapter or any rule		
5	adopted under this chapter shall be guilty of a violation, and		
6	shall be fined not less than \$100, and not more than $[\frac{500}{500}]$		
7	<u>\$1,000</u> for each offense, and ordered to pick up and remove		
8	litter from a public place under the supervision of the director		
9	as follows:		
10	(1) For the first offense, the violator shall spend four		
11	hours of either picking up litter or performing		
12	community service; and		
13	(2) For any subsequent offense, the violator shall spend		
14	eight hours of either picking up litter or performing		
15	community service.		
16	If the fine under this subsection was imposed by a county		
17	agency, the fine collected shall be deposited into that county's		
18	general fund. If the fine under this subsection was imposed by

12	(2)	Fund litter control and enforcement programs through
13		direct contract or direct transfer of funds to any
14		state or county agency that may enforce chapter 339 or

5	SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
6	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
7	begun before its effective date.
8	SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
9	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
10	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2010.



Report Title: Keiki Caucus; Littering; Fines

#### Description:

Increases the fine for littering. Requires moneys to be deposited into the county general fund for the county that imposed the fine or if the fine is imposed by the state, into the Environmental Management Special Fund (Special Fund). Authorizes moneys in the Special Fund to be used for enforcing the litter control law and criminal littering law. (SB2081 HD1)
