# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EARLY INTERVENTION SERVICES.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 321-352, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
amended to read as follows:

3 "§321-352 Early intervention services for infants and 4 toddlers with special needs. The department [may] shall develop 5 a statewide, coordinated, multidisciplinary program which contains a continuum of services to meet the needs of infants 6 7 and toddlers with special needs [-]; provided that children who turn three years of age during the school year shall continue to 8 9 be eligible for early intervention services under the 10 Individuals with Disabilities Education Improvement Act until 11 the beginning of the next school year if this is documented as 12 part of the individual family support transition plan. The department shall be the lead agency for the coordination of 13 14 federal and state funding for those programs. Pursuant to 15 chapter 103F, the department may purchase services appropriate to carry out activities under this part." 16
