## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DESECRATION.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 Section 711-1107, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is SECTION 1. 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "\$711-1107 Desecration. (1) A person commits the offense 4 of desecration if the person intentionally desecrates: 5 (a) Any public monument or structure; or (b) A place of worship [or burial]; or 7 (C) In a public place the national flag or any other 8 object of veneration by a substantial segment of the 9 public. 10 A person commits the offense of desecration if the 11 person negligently desecrates a place of burial. 12 [-(2)] (3) "Desecrate" means defacing, damaging, polluting, or otherwise physically mistreating in a way that the defendant 13 14 knows will outrage the sensibilities of persons likely to 15 observe or discover the defendant's action. 16 [-(3)] (4) Any person convicted of committing the offense of desecration shall be sentenced to a term of imprisonment of 17

- 1 not more than one year, a fine of not more than \$10,000, or
- 2 both."

- 3 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 4 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 5 begun before its effective date.
- 6 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 7 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 8 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
