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## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VETERANS.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Section 363-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended b	y amending subsection (c) to read as follows:
3	"(с)	The director shall have the following principal
4	functions	, duties, and powers:
5	(1)	Serve as the principal official in state government
6		responsible for the performance, development, and
7		control of programs, policies, and activities under
8		this chapter;
9	(2)	Oversee, supervise, and direct the performance by the
10		director's subordinates of activities in such areas as
11		planning, evaluation, and coordination of veterans
12		programs and development of a statewide service
13		delivery network;
14	(3)	Assess the policies and practices of other agencies
15		with respect to delivery of services and benefits to
16		veterans:
17	(4)	Administer funds allocated for the office, and apply
18		for, receive, and disburse grants and donations from

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1		all sources for veterans programs and services
2		provided under this chapter;
3	(5)	Establish a clearinghouse for complaints of persons
4	,	regarding services to veterans, or operations of state
5		and county agencies affecting veterans, investigate
6		such complaints, and refer the complaints and the
7		director's findings to the appropriate agency for
8		corrective action;
9	(6)	Adopt, amend, and repeal rules pursuant to chapter 91
10		for the purposes of this chapter;
11	(7)	Employ and retain such staff as may be necessary for
12		the purposes of this chapter, in conformance with
13		chapters 76, 89, and the appropriate collective
14		bargaining agreements, executive orders, executive
15		directives, or rules, except for the position of
16		coordinator and executive secretary to the director,
17		who shall be hired without regard to chapters 76 and
18		89;
19	(8)	Contract for or grant such services as may be
20		necessary for the purposes of this chapter, including
21		a master contract with other state agencies receiving
22		federal and state funds for programs and services for



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1 veterans, and purchase of service agreements with 2 appropriate agencies; [and] (9) Oversee the development, establishment, and operation 3 of a state veterans cemetery on Oahu; develop and 4 5 administer the policies and procedures of the state veterans cemetery in accordance with the United States 6 7 Department of Veterans [Administration] Affairs and 8 existing state guidelines; oversee the maintenance of 9 state veterans cemeteries on all islands [-;]; and 10 (10) Act on behalf of deceased veterans found to be 11 indigent at the time of death and without surviving. 12 immediate family members to ensure burial or cremation 13 services are provided and that the veteran's remains 14 are buried or inurned in a state veterans cemetery." 15 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 16 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 17 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2055.





**Report Title:** Veterans Rights and Benefits; Burial

Description:

Requires the Director of the Office of Veterans' Services to act on behalf of deceased veterans found to be indigent at the time of death and without surviving immediate family members to ensure the burial or cremation and inurnment of the veteran's remains in a state veterans cemetery. (SB2139 HD1)

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
