A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRANS FATS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and
- 3 to read as follows:
- 4 "PART . ARTIFICIAL TRANS FAT RESTRICTIONS
- 5 §321- Definitions. For purposes of this part:
- 6 "Artificial trans fat" means any kind of partially
- 7 hydrogenated vegetable oil, including vegetable shortening and
- 8 margarine.
- 9 "Food" means a raw, cooked, or processed edible substance,
- 10 ice, beverage, an ingredient used or intended for use or for
- 11 sale in whole or in part for human consumption, and chewing gum.
- "Food establishment" means any place or portion thereof,
- 13 maintained, used, or operated for the purpose of storing,
- 14 preparing, serving, manufacturing, packaging, transporting, or
- 15 otherwise handling food at the retail or wholesale level.
- 16 "Food establishment" includes any place where food is served or
- 17 provided to the public, with or without charge, regardless of



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1 whether the food is consumed on or off the premises. 2 establishment" does not include private homes where food is 3 prepared or served for individual family consumption; an 4 establishment that offers only prepackaged non-potentially 5 hazardous foods manufactured and packaged in an approved food 6 establishment; a produce stand that only offers whole, uncut 7 fresh fruits and vegetables; temporary food establishments that 8 sell or serve only non-potentially hazardous foods; a kitchen in 9 a private home, such as a small family day-care provider, or a 10 bed and breakfast operation that prepares and offers only non-11 potentially hazardous food to guests if the home is owner 12 occupied; a private home that receives catered or home delivered 13 food; food establishments that are inspected by another federal, 14 Hawaii state, or county regulatory agency, provided that a 15 memorandum of understanding or a memorandum of agreement has 16 been filed with the director of health and the agency assumes **17** regulatory responsibility for the establishment; the kitchen of 18 any establishment organization, business, private home, or other **19** location, when used only to prepare food for the homeless 20 without compensation, consideration, or donation by the person 21 or persons being served; and any location when used only to

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- 1 serve food to the homeless without compensation, consideration,
- 2 or donation by the person or persons being served.
- 3 §321- Artificial trans fat ban in food establishments.
- 4 (a) Beginning on January 1, 2011, every food establishment
- 5 shall maintain on the premises the label for any food or food
- 6 additive that is, or includes, any fat, oil, or shortening, for
- 7 as long as this food or food additive is stored, distributed, or
- 8 served by, or used in the preparation of food within, the food
- 9 establishment. The label described in this section refers to
- 10 the label that is required by applicable federal and state law
- 11 to be on the food or food additive at the time of purchase by
- 12 the food establishment.
- 13 (b) Beginning January 1, 2011, no oil, shortening, or
- 14 margarine containing artificial trans fat for use in spreads or
- 15 frying, except for the deep frying of yeast dough or cake
- 16 batter, may be stored, distributed, or served by, or used in the
- 17 preparation of any food within, a food establishment.
- 18 (c) Beginning January 1, 2012, no food containing
- 19 artificial trans fat, including oil and shortening that contains
- 20 artificial trans fat for use in the deep frying of yeast dough
- 21 or cake batter, may be stored, distributed, or served by, or

- 1 used in the preparation of any food within, a food
- 2 establishment.
- 3 (d) Subsections (b) and (c) shall not apply to food sold
- 4 or served in a manufacturer's original, sealed package.
- 5 (e) For purposes of this section, a food contains
- 6 artificial trans fat if the food contains vegetable shortening,
- 7 margarine, or any kind of artificially hydrogenated vegetable
- 8 oil, unless the label required on the food, pursuant to
- 9 applicable federal and state law, lists the trans fat content as
- 10 less than 0.5 grams per serving.
- 11 (f) Any violation of this section is a separate offense
- 12 that shall be punishable by a fine of not less than \$25 and not
- 13 more than \$1,000."
- 14 SECTION 2. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

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Report Title:

Artificial Trans Fat Restricted in Food Establishments

Description:

Prohibits foods containing artificial trans fat from being stored, distributed, or served by, or used in the preparation of any food within, a food establishment. Commences with ban on oils, shortening, and margarines with trans fat effective 01/01/11, and progresses with ban on food containing trans fat effective 01/01/12.

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
