A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO WITNESSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the per diem amount
- 2 for out-of-state witnesses has remained static for a number of
- 3 years. This amount is no longer sufficient to pay the personal
- 4 expenses of out-of-state witnesses, such as lodging and food.
- 5 Often these individuals are forced to take money out of their
- 6 own pockets to cover necessary personal expenses when subpoenaed
- 7 to return to the State as a witness in state court proceedings.
- 8 Because the per diem amount has not been adjusted to keep pace
- 9 with the cost of living in Hawaii, it has emerged as an economic
- 10 "barrier" that either discourages or prevents an out-of-state
- 11 witness from pursuing charges against offenders due to economic
- 12 considerations. Further, the legislature also finds that the
- 13 per diem amount for witnesses that are required to travel to an
- 14 island is also not sufficient to cover the personal expenses
- 15 when that witness is required to stay overnight.
- 16 The purpose of this Act is to increase the amount of per
- 17 diem for out-of-state witnesses as well as make available

3	SECT	ION 2. Section 621-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	amended by	y amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

8	attendance and a reasonable mileage fee to be established

- 4 expenses, such as board and lodging[. These per diem payments]
- 5 and shall be computed on the basis of quarter day periods of
- 6 time."
- 7 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 8 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 9 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Description:

Increases the per diem payments for out-of-state witnesses in criminal cases from \$110 to \$145. Provides an additional \$90 per diem payment for witnesses from any island other than the island on which the court is located, when that witness is required to stay overnight.
