A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE PRACTICE OF NURSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 The legislature finds that it is in the SECTION 1. 2 interest of the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the State that the practice of nursing be subject to regulation 3 and controls to assure that nurses at all levels are qualified 4 5 and competent and that only qualified persons are permitted to 6 engage in the practice of nursing. The legislature further finds that the practice of nursing, as defined in this Act, 7 merits the confidence of the public. The legislature recognizes 8 9 that the practice of nursing is continually evolving in response 10 to changes within the health care system.

SECTION 2. Chapter 457, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by adding six new sections to be appropriately designated and to read as follows:

14 "<u>\$457-</u> Practice of nursing. (a) Nursing is a
15 scientific process founded on a body of professional knowledge.
16 It is a learned profession based on an understanding of the
17 human condition across the lifespan of a client and the

1	It is also an art dedicated to caring for others. The practice
2	of nursing means assisting clients in attaining or maintaining
3	optimal health, implementing a strategy of care to accomplish
4	defined goals within the context of a client-centered health
5	care plan, and evaluating responses to nursing care and
6	treatment. Nursing is a dynamic discipline that is continually
7	evolving to include more sophisticated knowledge, technologies,
8	and client care activities. Nursing applies evidence-based
9	practice to promote optimal client outcomes.
10	(b) The scope of nursing practices established in this
11	chapter and by the rules of the board shall serve as general
12	guidelines and are not intended to address the appropriateness
13	of the use of specific procedures in any particular work setting
14	or to grant permission to implement specific procedures in any
15	particular work setting.
16	§457- Application of National Council of State Boards of
17	Nursing Model Nursing Practice Act and Model Nursing
18	Administrative Rules. (a) In accordance with chapter 91, the
19	board shall adopt the provisions of the NCSBN Model Nursing
20	Practice Act and Model Nursing Administrative Rules relating to
21	the scope and standards of nursing practice for registered
22	nurses, licensed practical nurses, and advanced practice

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registered nurses and shall adopt any subsequent modifications 1 2 adopted by the Delegate Assembly of the NCSBN; provided that the 3 board shall not be required to adopt rules or provisions that 4 the board finds are inappropriate or inapplicable. If the board finds that any rule or provision of the 5 (b) 6 NCSBN is inappropriate or inapplicable, the board shall state 7 clearly in the record of the board's proceedings the board's 8 rationale for rejecting or modifying the NCSBN's model rules. 9 (c) The NCSBN shall have no legal authority over the board 10 and shall have no legal authority or powers of oversight of the board in the exercise of its powers and duties authorized by 11 12 law. **Registered nurse**. Practice as a registered nurse 13 §457-14 means the full scope of nursing, regardless of compensation or personal profit, that incorporates caring for all clients in all 15 16 settings and is guided by the scope of practice authorized by this chapter, the rules of the board, and nursing standards 17 18 established or recognized by the board including but not limited 19 to: 20 The National Council of State Boards of Nursing Model (1) 21 Nursing Practice Act, Article II, Scope of Nursing 22 Practice, Section 2; and

9	practical nurse means the directed scope of nursing practice,
10	regardless of compensation or personal profit, that takes place
11	under the direction of a registered nurse, advanced practice
12	registered nurse, licensed physician, or other health care
13	provider authorized by the State, and is guided by the scope of
14	practice authorized by this chapter, the rules of the board, and
15	nursing standards established or recognized by the board
16	including but not limited to:
17	(1) The National Council of State Boards of Nursing Model
18	Nursing Practice Act, Article II, Scope of Nursing
19	Practice, Section 3; and
20	(2) The National Council of State Boards of Nursing Model
21	Nursing Administrative Rules, Chapter Two, Standards
22	of Nursing Practice, Sections 2.3.1 through 2.3.3;



1 provided that NCSBN shall have no legal authority over the board 2 and shall have no legal authority or powers of oversight of the 3 board in the exercise of its powers and duties authorized by 4 law. 5 §457- Advanced practice registered nurse. (a) Practice 6 as an advanced practice registered nurse means the scope of 7 nursing in a category approved by the board, regardless of 8 compensation or personal profit, and includes the registered nurse scope of practice. The scope of an advanced practice 9 10 registered nurse includes but is not limited to advanced 11 assessment and the diagnosis, prescription, selection, and 12 administration of therapeutic measures including over the 13 counter drugs, legend drugs, and controlled substances within 14 the advanced practice registered nurse's role and specialty-15 appropriate education and certification. 16 (b) The advanced practice registered nurse's scope of 17 practice supersedes the registered nurse's scope of practice. 18 Advanced practice registered nurses shall practice within 19 standards established or recognized by the board and be guided 20 by the scope of practice authorized by this chapter, the rules 21 of the board, and nursing standards established or recognized by 22 the board including but not limited to: 2010-1275 SB2163 SD2 SMA.doc

20	of knowle	dge and skill of the unlicensed assistive personnel;
21	provided	that the delegation of tasks, functions, and activities
22	complies	with applicable federal and state laws; and provided
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1	further t	hat the practice-pervasive functions of assessment,
2	evaluatic	n, and nursing judgment shall not be delegated.
3	(b)	The delegating nurse is responsible for individually
4	assessing	the patient and the situational circumstances and for
5	ascertain	ing the competence of the delegatee before delegating
6	any task,	function, or activity. The delegating nurse shall
7	supervise	, monitor, evaluate, and follow-up on instructions to a
8	delegatee	after delegating any task, function, or activity. The
9	delegatee	shall assume liability for accepting the delegation
10	and for t	he delegatee's own actions in carrying out the
11	delegated	task, function, or activity.
12	(c)	When delegating a task, function, or activity, a
13	delegatin	g nurse shall use the NCSBN delegation decision-making
14	process a	s a model for decision-making. The delegating nurse
15	shall con	sider and carefully analyze:
16	(1)	Patient needs and circumstances;
17	(2)	Qualifications of the proposed delegatee;
18	(3)	The nature of the delegating nurse's delegation
19		authority set forth in this chapter;
20	(4)	The delegating nurse's personal competence in the area
21		of nursing relevant to the task, function, or activity
22		to be delegated; and



1	(5)	The protocols contained in NCSBN documents, including
2		but not limited to: Five Rights of Delegation,
3		Delegation-Decision Making Tree, and The Continuum of
4		Care Framework."
5	SECT	ION 3. Section 329-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6	amended by amending the definition of "advanced practice	
7	registere	d nurse with prescriptive authority" to read as
8	follows:

10	authority	" means a person licensed under section 457-8.6 who is
11	registere	d under this chapter to administer or prescribe a
12	controlle	d substance [-]; provided that an advanced practice
13	registere	d nurse with prescriptive authority shall not be
14	authorize	d to request, receive, or sign for professional
15	controlle	d substance samples."
16	SECT	ION 4. Section 329-121, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
17	amended by	y amending the definition of "physician" to read as
18	follows:	
19	" " Phy	ysician" means a person who is licensed to practice
20	[medicine	or osteopathic medicine] under chapter 453 and is
21	licensed v	with authority to prescribe drugs and is registered
22	under sect	ion 329-32. "Physician" does not include physician's
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1	assistant or advanced practice registered nurse with
2	prescriptive authority as described in section 453-5.3 or [an
3	advanced practice registered nurse with prescriptive authority
4	as described in section] 457-8.6."
5	SECTION 5. Section 457-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6	amended to read as follows:
7	"§457-2 Definitions. (a) As used in this chapter unless
8	the content otherwise requires:
9	"Advanced practice registered nurse" means a registered
10	nurse who has met the qualifications for advanced practice
11	registered nurse set forth in this chapter and through rules of
12	the board, which shall include educational requirements.
13	"Board" means the state board of nursing.
14	"NCSBN" means the National Council of State Boards of
15	Nursing.
16	"Nurse" means a person licensed under this chapter or a
17	person who holds a license under the laws of another state or
18	territory of the United States that is equivalent to a license
19	under this chapter.
20	"Telehealth" means the use of electronic information and
21	telecommunication technologies to support long-distance clinical
22	health care, patient and professional health-related education,
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public health and health administration, to the extent that it
 relates to nursing.

3 "The practice of nursing as a licensed practical nurse" 4 means the performance of those acts commensurate with the 5 required educational preparation and demonstrated competency of the individual, whereby the individual shall be accountable and 6 responsible to the consumer for the quality of nursing care 7 8 rendered. The foregoing may include, but shall not be limited 9 to $[\tau]$: implementation of basic nursing procedures in the plan of 10 care; [or] observing and caring for individuals at all levels of the health spectrum, giving counsel and acting to safeguard life 11 12 and health and functioning as a part of the health care team, 13 under the direction of a dentist, [medical doctor or osteopath,] 14 physician, osteopathic physician, registered nurse, or podiatrist licensed in accordance with chapter 448, 453, 457, or 15 463E; [or] administration of treatment and medication as 16 prescribed; [or] promotion of health maintenance of individuals, 17 families, or groups; or teaching and supervision of auxiliary 18 19 personnel.

20 "The practice of nursing as a registered nurse" means the 21 performance of professional services commensurate with the 22 educational preparation and demonstrated competency of the 2010-1275 SB2163 SD2 SMA.doc Page 11

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individual having specialized knowledge, judgment, and skill 1 based on the principles of the biological, physical, behavioral, 2 3 and sociological sciences and nursing theory, whereby the 4 individual shall be accountable and responsible to the consumer 5 for the quality of nursing care rendered. The foregoing may 6 include $[\tau]$ but shall not be limited to $[\tau]$ observation, 7 assessment, development, implementation, and evaluation of a 8 plan of care, health counseling, supervision and teaching of other personnel, and teaching of individuals, families, and 9 10 groups in any stage of health or illness; [or] administration, supervision, coordination, delegation, and evaluation of nursing 11 12 practice; [or provisions] provision of health care to the 13 patient in collaboration with other members of the health care 14 team as autonomous health care professionals providing the 15 nursing component of health care; or utilization of reasonable 16 judgment in carrying out prescribed medical orders of a licensed 17 dentist, [medical doctor or osteopath,] physician, osteopathic physician, or podiatrist licensed in accordance with chapter 18 19 448, 453, or 463E or the orders of an advanced practice 20 registered nurse recognized in accordance with this chapter. 21 (b) Definitions applicable to this chapter shall also include those used in the NCSBN Model Nursing Practice Act and 22 2010-1275 SB2163 SD2 SMA.doc

2	otherwise requires. Where a definition in the NCSBN Model
3	Nursing Practice Act or Model Nursing Administrative Rules
4	conflicts with a definition in chapter 457 or 436B, the
5	definitions contained in chapter 457 or 436B and the rules of
6	the board shall apply."
7	SECTION 6. Title 16, chapter 89C, Hawaii Administrative
8	Rules, shall be repealed upon the state board of nursing's
9	adoption of rules relating to advanced practice registered nurse
10	prescriptive authority; provided that section 16-89C-10, Hawaii
11	Administrative Rules, relating to collegial working relationship
12	and all other references to collegial working relationship in
13	title 16, chapter 89C, Hawaii Administrative Rules, shall be
14	repealed upon the effective date of this Act.
15	SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
16	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
17	SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
