A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO COUNTIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Article VIII, section 2, of the Hawaii
 constitution states, in relevant part, that,

3 "Each political subdivision shall have the power to
4 frame and adopt a charter for its own self-government
5 within such limits and under such procedures as may be
6 provided by general law.

7 * *

8 Charter provisions with respect to a political 9 subdivision's executive, legislative and administrative 10 structure and organization shall be superior to statutory 11 provisions, subject to the authority of the legislature to 12 enact general laws allocating and reallocating powers and 13 functions."

14 The purpose of this Act is to authorize the counties to 15 appoint and remove their respective personnel directors pursuant 16 to their respective county charter. 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organization, and is therefore supported by and consistent with 1 2 the principle of county self-governance established in article 3 VIII, section 2 of the Hawaii constitution. This Act also provides the mayor of each county, in 4 addition to the merit appeals board, with the authority to 5 6 appoint and remove the personnel director. Section 76-75, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 7 SECTION 2. 8 amended to read as follows: "§76-75 Personnel director. [The] Either the merit 9 appeals board or the mayor of each county, as prescribed by the 10 11 charter of each county, shall appoint and may at pleasure remove a personnel director, who shall be the chief administrative 12 officer of the department of civil service. The director 13 [shall], at the time of the director's appointment, and 14 thereafter, shall be thoroughly familiar with the principles and 15 16 methods of personnel administration and shall believe in applying merit principles and scientific administrative methods 17 18 to public personnel administration." 19 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 20

21 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
