A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE CIVIL DEFENSE AND EMERGENCY ACT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 127-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
amended to read as follows:

3 "§127-7 Compensation, rights, privileges, and immunities. 4 No person engaged in actual disaster relief pursuant to this chapter, including a volunteer whose services are accepted by 5 6 any person authorized by the director of disaster relief, 7 including providing shelter in case of natural or man-made 8 disaster, shall be liable, civilly or criminally, for any act or 9 acts done by the person in pursuance of the person's duty; 10 provided that nothing herein shall preclude recovery by any 11 person for injury or damage sustained from the operation of any 12 vehicle which may be insured under section 41D-8, and the 13 director is hereby authorized to insure vehicles owned by the 14 State or in the custody and use of the disaster relief agency. 15 All persons, including volunteers whose services have been 16 accepted by persons authorized by the director, shall, while 17 engaged in the performance of duty pursuant to this chapter, 18 including duty performed during periods of training, be deemed 2010-1066 SB2202 SD1 SMA.doc

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state employees and shall have the powers, duties, rights, and 1 2 privileges of employees in the performance of their duty. All 3 persons who may otherwise be employees of the State or of any 4 political subdivision shall continue to receive the compensation 5 they would otherwise receive; and shall for the purposes of the employees retirement system, or any applicable workers' 6 7 compensation law be deemed to be engaged in the performance of their ordinary duties. All other persons when engaged in actual 8 9 disaster relief, including volunteers whose services have been 10 accepted by persons authorized by the director, shall be 11 entitled to compensation from the State at the rate paid to 12 jurors; provided this provision shall not be construed to prohibit the contracting for medical or other technical services 13 14 at higher rates of compensation. Further, in case of injury or 15 death arising out of and in the performance of duty pursuant to this chapter, including duty performed during periods of 16 training, such persons or their dependents shall be entitled to 17 18 all of the benefits provided in chapter 386, including medical services and supplies; provided that for the purposes of the 19 benefits, average weekly wages shall be computed upon the basis 20 21 of earnings from the usual employment of such persons. The cost 22 thereof shall be a charge upon the state insurance fund.

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Nothing herein shall affect the right of any person to receive
any benefits or compensation under any act of Congress."
SECTION 2. New statutory material is underscored.
SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
