A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PRESCRIPTIVE RIGHTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 453, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by adding two new sections to be appropriately 3 designated and to read as follows: 4 "§453-A Non-physician provider prescription drug 5 formulary. (a) The Hawaii medical board shall establish, 6 pursuant to chapter 91, a drug formulary advisory subcommittee 7 for each non-physician health care practice whose licensed 8 practitioners are granted prescriptive authority by law. The 9 purpose of each subcommittee shall be to establish and publish a **10** drug formulary for prescription, administration, or dispensing by non-physician health care providers who are granted 11 12 prescriptive authority by law. 13 (b) There shall be established subcommittees representing: 14 (1) Naturopathic physicians; 15 Advanced practice registered nurses with prescriptive (2) 16 authority;
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Pharmacists;

4	(c)	Each subcommittee established pursuant to subsection
5	(a) shall	consist of:
6	(1)	Five persons licensed as members of the profession
7		represented by the subcommittee and appointed by the
8		statutorily-designated governing body of the
9		profession;
10	(2)	One person appointed by the Hawaii medical board; and
11	(3)	One person licensed as a pharmacist and appointed by
12		the board of pharmacy.
13	<u>(c)</u>	A drug formulary advisory subcommittee shall recommend
14	the appli	cable formularies for each respective non-physician
15	health ca	re profession whose members are authorized by law to
16	prescribe	, administer, or dispense prescription drugs. The
17	Hawaii me	dical board shall consider the recommendations of the
18	drug form	ulary subcommittee in adopting a formulary for the
19	respectiv	e health care profession. The drug formularies
20	establish	ed pursuant to this section shall be adopted by the
21	Hawaii me	dical board in accordance with chapter 91.

6	SECT	ION 2. Section 329-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
. 7	amended b	y amending the definition of "practitioner" to read as
8	follows:

10	(1)	A physician, dentist, veterinarian, scientific
11		investigator, non-physician health care professional
12		with prescriptive authority, or other person licensed
13		and registered under section 329-32 to distribute,
14		dispense, or conduct research with respect to a
15		controlled substance in the course of professional
16		practice or research in this State;
17	(2)	An advanced practice registered nurse with
18		prescriptive authority licensed and registered under
19		section 329-32 to prescribe and administer controlled
20		substances in the course of professional practice in
21		this State; and

2	registered, or otherwise permitted to distribute,
3	dispense, conduct research with respect to or to
4	administer a controlled substance in the course of
5	professional practice or research in this State."
6	SECTION 3. Section 455-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
7	amended by amending the definition of "naturopathic formulary"
8	to read as follows:
9	""Naturopathic formulary" means vitamins, minerals, dietary
10	supplements, botanical medicines, homeopathic medicines,
11	hormones, and those legend drugs consistent with naturopathic
12	medical practice[-] as established by the Hawaii medical board
13	pursuant to section 453-A."
14	SECTION 4. Section 455-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
15	amended to read as follows:
16	"§455-6 Powers and authority of the board. In addition to
17	any other powers and duties authorized by law, the board may:
18	(1) Adopt and use a seal to be affixed to all official
19	acts of the board;
20	(2) Adopt, amend, or repeal rules in accordance with
21	chapter 91 to carry out the purposes of this chapter;
22	provided that all rules shall be approved by the

19		violat	ion of this chapter and any rules of the board;
20	(6)	Mainta	in a record of its proceedings;
21	[-(7)-	Annual:	ly establish and publish a naturopathic
22		formul	ary that has been approved by the board for

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1		prescription, administration, or dispensing by	
2		naturopathic physicians; and	
3	(8)	Do all things necessary to carry out the functions,	
4		powers, and duties set forth in this chapter."	
5	SECT	ION 5. Section 455-11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
6	amended b	y amending subsection (a) to read as follows:	
7	"(a)	In addition to any other actions authorized by law,	
8	the board	shall have the power to deny, revoke, suspend, or	
9	refuse to	renew any license to practice naturopathic medicine	
10	applied fo	or or issued by the board in accordance with this	
11	chapter, and to fine or otherwise discipline a licensee for an		
12	cause authorized by law, including but not limited to the		
13	following	:	
14	(1)	Procuring, or aiding or abetting in procuring, a	
15		criminal abortion;	
16	(2)	Employing any person to solicit patients;	
17	(3)	Obtaining a fee on the assurance that a manifestly	
18		incurable disease can be permanently cured;	
19	(4)	Betraying a patient's confidence;	
20	(5)	Making any untruthful and improbable statement in	
21		advertising one's naturopathic practice or business;	
22	(6)	False, fraudulent, or deceptive advertising;	
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1	(7)	Being habituated to the excessive use of drugs or
2		alcohol; or being addicted to, dependent on, or an
3		habitual user of a narcotic, barbiturate, amphetamine,
4		hallucinogen, or other drug having similar effects;
5	(8)	Practicing naturopathic medicine while the ability to
6		practice is impaired by alcohol, drug, physical
7		disability, or mental instability;
8	(9)	Procuring a license through fraud, misrepresentation,
9		or deceit or knowingly permitting an unlicensed person
10		to perform activities requiring a license;
11	(10)	Professional misconduct or gross carelessness or
12		manifest incapacity in the practice of naturopathic
13		medicine;
14	(11)	Conduct or practice contrary to recognized standard of
15		ethics of the naturopathic profession;
16	(12)	Using medical service or treatment which is
17		inappropriate or unnecessary;
18	(13)	Submitting to or filing with the board any notice,
19		statement, or other document required under this
20		chapter which is false or untrue or contains any
21		material misstatement of fact;

1	(14)	Failure to report to the board any disciplinary action	
2		taken against the licensee in another jurisdiction	
3		within thirty days after the disciplinary action	
4		becomes final;	
5	(15)	Using the title "physician" without clearly	
6		identifying oneself as being a naturopathic physician	
7	(16)	Prescribing, administering, and dispensing	
8		naturopathic formulary that are not included in the	
9		formulary established by the [board under section	
10		455-6;] Hawaii medical board under section 453-A; and	
11	(17)	Violation of any provision of this chapter or rules	
12		adopted under this chapter."	
13	SECT	ION 6. Section 457-8.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
14	amended to	o read as follows:	
15	"§45'	7-8.6 Prescriptive authority for advanced practice	
16	registere	d nurses. (a) The board shall grant prescriptive	
17	authority	to qualified advanced practice registered nurses and	
18	shall des	ignate the requirements for advanced nursing practice	
19	related to	prescriptive authority. [The board shall determine	
20	the exclusionary formulary for qualified advanced practice		
21	registere	d nurses who are granted prescriptive authority.	

1	(b)	The department of commerce and consumer affairs shall
2	establish	a joint formulary advisory committee composed of:
3	-(1)-	Two persons licensed as advanced practice registered
4		nurses and appointed by the board;
5	(2)	Two persons licensed in medicine by the Hawaii medical
6		board and appointed by the Hawaii medical board;
7	-(3)	Three persons licensed as pharmacists and appointed by
8		the board of pharmacy;
9	(4)	One representative of the University of Hawaii John A.
10		Burns school of medicine appointed by the dean of the
11		University of Hawaii John A. Burns school of medicine,
12		and
13	(5)	One representative from a school of nursing with an
14		advanced practice registered nurse program.
15	The joint	formulary advisory committee shall recommend the
16	applicabl	e formulary for persons recognized under this section.
17	The board	shall consider the recommendations of the joint
18	formulary	advisory committee in adopting the formulary.] The
19	appropria	te working relationship with licensed physicians shall
20	be reflec	ted in rules adopted by the board in accordance with
21	chapter 9	91.

1	[(c)] <u>(b)</u> The board shall establish nursing requirements
2	for education, experience, and national certification pursuant
3	to rules adopted in accordance with chapter 91.
4	[(d)] <u>(c)</u> Advanced practice registered nurses shall be
5	considered qualified if they have met the requirements of
6	section 457-8.5(a), and have met the advanced pharmacology
7	requirements for initial prescriptive authority pursuant to
8	rules adopted by the board. Only qualified advanced practice
9	registered nurses authorized to diagnose, prescribe, and
10	institute therapy or referrals of patients to health care
11	agencies, health care providers, and community resources and,
12	only as appropriate, to the practice specialty in which the
13	advanced practice nurse is qualified, may:
14	(1) Prescribe, procure, administer, and dispense over the
15	counter and legend drugs, and controlled substances
16	pursuant to this chapter and to chapter 329; provided
17	that an advanced practice registered nurse shall not
18	request, receive, or sign for professional controlled
19	substance samples;
20	(2) Prescribe, order, and dispense medical devices and
21	equipment; and

1	(3) Plan and initiate a therapeutic regimen that includes
2	nutritional, diagnostic, and supportive services
3	including home health care, hospice, and physical and
4	occupational therapy."
5	SECTION 7. In codifying the new sections added by section
6	1 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
7	appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating
8	the new sections in this Act.
9	SECTION 8. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
10	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
11	SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2010.
