A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE COMMISSION ON SALARIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Act 299, Session Laws of Hawaii 2006,

established the commission on salaries to review and recommend

an appropriate salary for the governor, lieutenant governor,

4 members of the legislature, justices and judges of all state

5 courts, administrative director of the State or an equivalent

 $oldsymbol{6}$ position, and department heads or executive officers and the

7 deputies or assistants to the department heads. However, Act

 $oldsymbol{8}$ 299 did not provide for a public hearing by the commission on

9 the salary recommendations. The legislature finds a public

hearing on the recommendations is necessary to inform the public

11 and to solicit public input, so that the legislature may be

12 adequately apprised of the justification for the recommendations

in order to determine whether to disapprove the recommendations.

14 The purpose of this Act is to provide for a public hearing

15 to be conducted by the commission on salaries on its salary

16 recommendations.

- 1 SECTION 2. Section 26-56, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending subsection (d) to read as follows: 3 "(d) The commission shall convene in the month of November 4 2006, and every six years thereafter. Not later than the 5 fortieth legislative day of the regular session of 2007, and 6 every six years thereafter, the commission shall submit a report 7 of its findings and its salary recommendations to the 8 legislature, through the governor. Prior to submitting its 9 report to the legislature, the commission shall conduct a public 10 hearing on the island of Oahu to solicit public comment on the 11 report; provided that the public hearing shall be subject to the 12 open meeting and public notice requirements of chapter 92; and 13 provided further that not less than seventy-two hours prior to 14 the hearing the commission shall give public notice of the 15 hearing in accordance with section 1-28.5, as well as the 16 internet address where the report is accessible. The commission 17 may include a summary of comments received during the public 18 hearing in its report to the legislature. The commission may 19 include incremental increases that take effect prior to the 20 convening of the next salary commission. 21 The recommended salaries submitted by the commission shall
 - become effective July 1 of the next fiscal year unless the

- 1 legislature disapproves the recommended salaries submitted by
- 2 the commission through the adoption of a concurrent resolution,
- 3 which shall be approved by a simple majority of each house of
- 4 the legislature, prior to adjournment sine die of the
- 5 legislative session in which the recommended salaries are
- 6 submitted; provided that any change in salary [which] that
- 7 becomes effective shall not apply to the legislature to which
- 8 the recommendation for the change in salary was submitted.
- 9 The governor shall include the salary amounts recommended
- 10 by the commission and approved by the legislature for employees
- 11 of the executive branch in the executive budget. If the salary
- 12 amounts recommended by the commission are disapproved by the
- 13 legislature, the commission shall reconvene in the November next
- 14 following the legislative disapproval to review the
- 15 legislature's reasons for disapproving its salary
- 16 recommendation. The commission may submit a report of its
- 17 findings and submit a new salary recommendation to the
- 18 legislature at the next regular session. The commission's
- 19 reconvening following a legislative disapproval shall not toll
- 20 the six-year cycle."
- 21 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 22 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
