A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Chapter 88, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to
 read as follows:

4	" <u>§88</u>	Reinstatement of benefits. An individual whose:
5	(1)	Benefits under this chapter arose from that
6		individual's spouse's or reciprocal beneficiary's
7		membership in the employees' retirement system through
8		employment as a police officer, firefighter, deputy
9		sheriff, or public safety officer; and
10	(2)	Pension or benefit was terminated by reason of
11		remarriage, marriage, or entry into a new reciprocal
12		beneficiary relationship occurring subsequent to the
13		death of the member,
14	may have	the terminated pension or benefit reinstated upon a
15	written a	oplication to the applicable system. The level of
16	reinstated	d pension or benefit payment shall be the amount
17	received 1	by the surviving spouse or surviving reciprocal



1	beneficiary on the date that the payment was terminated,
2	adjusted to reflect ad hoc and scheduled increases from the date
3	of termination to the date of reinstatement. Benefit payments
4	accruing between the effective date of reinstatement and the
5	date reinstated benefits payments commence shall be paid without
6	interest."
7	SECTION 2. Section 88-21, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
8	amended by adding two new definitions to be appropriately
9	inserted and to read as follows:
10	" "Deputy sheriff": an employee in the department of public
11	safety who has been conferred police power by the director of
12	public safety pursuant to section 353C-4 and is in a position of
13	deputy sheriff I through V.
14	"Public safety officer": any individual employed as a
15	corrections officer, investigator of the department of the
16	prosecuting attorney, investigator of the department of the
17	attorney general, narcotics enforcement investigator, water
18	safety officer, or public safety investigations staff
19	investigator."
20	SECTION 3. Section 88-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

21 amended to read as follows:

19 (2) If the recipient or beneficiary is a surviving spouse
20 or <u>surviving</u> reciprocal beneficiary, the pension so
21 granted shall cease when the surviving spouse or
22 surviving reciprocal beneficiary remarries, marries,

15	amended b	y amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows:

19	the amoun	t of the member's accumulated contributions and there
20	shall be j	paid in lieu of the ordinary death benefit payable

21 under section 88-84, a pension of one-half of the average final

22 compensation of the member:

1 Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, any (b) 2 condition of impairment of health caused by any disease of the 3 heart, lungs, or respiratory system, resulting in death to a 4 firefighter, police officer, or sewer worker, shall be presumed 5 to have been suffered in the actual performance of duty at some 6 definite time and place through no wilful negligence on the 7 firefighter's, police officer's, or sewer worker's part, and as 8 a result of the inherent occupational hazard of exposure to and 9 inhalation of smoke, toxic gases, chemical fumes, and other 10 toxic vapors, unless the contrary [be] is shown by competent 11 evidence; provided that [such] the firefighter, police officer, 12 or sewer worker shall have passed a physical examination on 13 entry or subsequent to entry into [such] that service [or 14 subsequent to such entry], which examination failed to reveal 15 any evidence of [such] that condition."

9 For the purpose of determining eligibility for the ordinary 10 death benefit, a year round school employee shall be considered 11 in service during the July and August preceding a transfer to a 12 traditional school schedule if the employee was in service for 13 the entire prior school year and has a contract for the upcoming 14 traditional school year. The application for ordinary death 15 benefits shall be filed no later than three years from the date 16 of the member's death.

(c) In the case of accidental death as determined by the board pursuant to section 88-85.5, the death benefit shall be effective on the first day of the month following the member's death, except for the month of December when retirement on the first or last day of the month shall be allowed, as follows:

Report Title:

Employees' Retirement System; Surviving Spouse or Reciprocal Beneficiary Benefits

Description:

Allows the surviving spouse or surviving reciprocal beneficiary of a police officer, firefighter, deputy sheriff, or public safety officer in the employees' retirement system who died in the line of duty to remarry, marry, or enter into a new reciprocal beneficiary relationship and to continue to receive pension and other retirement benefits arising from their former spouse's employment. Allows for the reinstatement of benefits.
