A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ELECTRONIC WARRANT VOUCHERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the State of Hawaii is slowly progressing into the electronic/digital age. 2 3 private vendors that do business with the State of Hawaii are 4 trying to streamline their invoicing of goods and services by 5 sending electronic documents to the various departments to be 6 utilized as original vouchers, bills of materials, and other 7 supporting documents. The legislature further finds that in the 8 future, if a new, state-of-the-art accounting system is 9 implemented in state departments, there may be options to attach 10 electronic documents to purchase orders or other contract 11 encumbrances for review and authorization without having to 12 automatically print the documents, which would save paper. 13 The purpose of this Act is to provide flexibility to the 14 department of accounting and general services, the University of **15** Hawaii, and the department of education to accept electronically

mailed warrant vouchers, bills of materials, and other

supporting documents as original documents.

- 1 liability or expense that all the materials, supplies, and
- 2 incidentals have been received in good order and condition,
- 3 unless the bill is for an advance payment or a deposit to be
- 4 paid as specified in the department's purchase order, in which
- 5 case the certification of the original bill by the subordinate
- 6 officer is not required. Any advance payment made under this
- 7 section must conform to the common business practice for making
- 8 such payment as determined by the comptroller [-] or the
- 9 respective chief financial officers of the University of Hawaii
- 10 and the department of education."

Allows the department of education, department of accounting and general services, and the University of Hawaii to accept electronically mailed warrant vouchers for bills of materials, supplies, and incidentals as original documentation, the receipt of which authorizes payment to be made to each individual to whom the State is indebted. Effective 1/1/2099.
